


President's Message

C8 MID-ENGINE

THE FUTURE OF CORVETTE

The introduction of the all new C8 on July 18th generated a lot of excitement in the Corvette and auto communities. In the weeks following I have heard both positive and negative comments about the car. People need to get over it. The fact is this is the next generation of Corvette and if you don't like it ... don't buy it.

Personally, from the pictures, I think it is a beautiful car. On line I see that a lot of people are scrambling to order one. There may be one in my future but I think that the prudent thing is to wait at least a year to see if any bugs surface and need to be ironed out.

Many of us have watched the reveal and read about the C8 already. I am including some information from the <u>Chevy web site</u> on this awesome all new Corvette:



The mid-engine configuration provides incredible visibility, responsiveness and driving feel. The new engine placement provides rear weight bias, meaning more power is directed to the rear wheels where it matters most. And with the windshield now over the front wheels, there's improved down force without the need for a front air dam.



Even storage has been thoughtfully engineered. An all-new front cargo area is large enough to carry an airline-size overhead bag, while the trunk can hold two golf bags or the removable roof panel.

The all-new body structure is more than 10% stiffer than the previous generation, which contributes to ride and confidence-inspiring handling.

With the engine in the rear, engineers were able to lower the cowl, hood, instrument panel and steering wheel for the utmost in forward vision.

Every detail is designed to provide a natural and immersive driving experience that's tailored to you. Each button exactly where it needs to be for comfortable, intuitive use. And with three seat combinations to choose from, there's sure to be one that perfectly suits you.

Only a single part has been carried over from the last generation

- Door handles and the hatch and hood releases have been hidden for a perfectly clean appearance and improved aerodynamics
- The all-new LT2 V8 engine is visible through a rear hatch window
- Available Engine Appearance Package adds carbon-fiber components as well as LED lights to illuminate the engine

There was a large sign and a registration point specifically for Corvettes. Some less attentive drivers, including me, missed the notice and entered either the preregistered or not registered lines for other cars. Soon a gentleman ran up to my car with my registration and explained I would most likely have to drive around the grounds and find my way back to the correct entrance.



After some self-inflicted long waiting lines, I took a side road off to the right which led to the hospital buildings and a blocked road. I went through the barriers which fortunately were spaced widely enough for my Vette to fit through. Finally I made it back to the Corvette entrance and found some members of EMCC. Parking for the Corvettes was as near to parking in a private grandstand as it could be. We sat under a tree and watched each and every car drive by. It reminded us of sitting at Bass Pro with its viewing of the entrance as cars passed in review.

There were at least six members from EMCC at the show but half arrived in hot rods and trucks and had to park elsewhere. Corvette representation was good with numerous C3's a couple of C5's, three C1's with two of '59 vintage. One was Bob Grenier's and the other a white convertible "barn find'. Among the cars entering was an early model Stanley Streamer that caught everyone's eye



with its somewhat exaggerated race car lines. It left the show early and as it very rapidly moved on down the road, the driver blew his horn that sounded like a loud train whistle rolling through the hills. As a point of interest Stanley Steamers were manufactured in Watertown, MA just off Galen St which links Newton Corner and Watertown Center. The factory was eventually purchased by Louis Fabian Bachrach, a world re-knowned photographer, as his headquarters and to my knowledge, remains under the management of his grandson's today. My father was his chauffer and caretaker of his estate in Newton for forty years. As the show came to a close, it was announced that Bob Grenier took home a significant silver colored trophy for second place in his class.

2020 Corvette Debuts as a Stingray

The 2020 Chevrolet Corvette made it's debut as a Stingray July 18, 2019. Did you know the second generation Corvette debuted as a Sting Ray in 1963? This nameplate ran until 1976, and was then revived in 2014 to introduce the seventh generation Corvette. Chevrolet is proud to announce the Stingray name will live on.


Tonawanda-Built Next Gen 6.2L Small Block V-8 to Power All-New 2020 Chevrolet Corvette Stingray

General Motors Co. (NYSE: GM) confirmed its Tonawanda, New York, engine plant will build the company's next-generation 6.2L Small Block V-8 engine that will power the all-new 2020 Chevrolet Corvette Stingray. Production of the 2020 Corvette Stingray begins at GM's Bowling Green, Kentucky assembly plant in late 2019.

This news follows the reveal of the 2020 Corvette in Tustin, California.

Powered by the Tonawanda-built next-gen 6.2L Small Block V-8 LT2 engine, the 2020 Stingray will offer customers the most horsepower and torque of any entry Corvette: SAE-certified to 495 hp and SAE-certified to 470 lb.-ft. of torque (when equipped with performance exhaust.)

"The 2020 Stingray is Chevrolet's first production mid-engine Corvette – the fastest, most powerful entry Corvette ever – offering new levels of performance, technology and craftsmanship," said Mark Reuss, GM president, during a visit to the plant to meet with employees and community leaders. "The Tonawanda team is up to the challenge to build this new LT2 engine at world-class quality levels that Corvette customers have come to expect."

CARS & COFFEE at THE MANSIONS

If you have never been to a cars and coffee event held on the lawn of one Newport's historic mansions then you are missing out on a good time. This is my third year attending some of their events...trying to visit all of the different venues. Most recently on July 27 at Mcauley Hall at Salve Regina University. The building was formerly:

"Vinland Estate, completed in 1884. The Romanesque Revival style "cottage" was built for tobacco heiress Catharine Lorillard Wolfe by the acclaimed architecture firm of Peabody & Stearns. At the time, Catharine Lorillard Wolfe was the richest woman in America. The name 'Vinland" was bestowed upon the summer cottage in reference to the Vikings who were believed have arrived in Newport hundreds of years before. Ms. Wolfe was inspired by a poem written by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow which spoke of the Vikings' journey across the Atlantic. It is because of this poem that Vinland Estate bears many Celtic and Nordic motifs.

These events are hosted by the <u>Audrain Automobile Museum</u> which is located in downtown Newport. As we roll into August there are still <u>seven events</u> listed on the schedule.

Events are free but you are asked to preregister on their <u>web site</u> to make sure there is parking for everyone and for early admission.

Although there were many very cool cars there two of the most special were a blue 1958 AC Aceca Bristol. It is a two-place fastback coupe that came to the us in early 1959. According to information with the car only 319 Aceas were produced and of that only 169 were fitted with the Bristol engine. This vehicle ran in the 12 Hours of Sebering Autocross in stock condition.



The second awesome car was a 1965 Shelby Cobra 289 roadster. Posted on the car: Ex-racer Shelby created the legendary Cobra in 1962 by installing Ford's lightweight V-8 engine in a slightly lengthened nose of the AC Ace. AC's Thames-Ditton facility shipped the body and chassis to California where Shelby American dropped in the engine and completed assembly. The first 75 production models had the 260cid V-8 while others used the 289 v 8 and beginning in 1965, the Ford 427 V-8. A total of 654 units were produced from 1962-1968.


