



On this day in 1994, the ashes of 71-year-old George Swanson are buried (according to Swanson's request) in the driver's seat of his 1984 white Corvette in Hempfield County, Pennsylvania.

Swanson, a beer distributor and former U.S. Army sergeant during World War II, died the previous March 31 at the age of 71. He had reportedly been planning his automobile burial for some time, buying 12 burial plots at Brush Creek Cemetery, located 25 miles east of Pittsburgh, in order to ensure that his beloved Corvette would fit in his grave with him. After his death, however, the cemetery balked, amid concerns of vandalism and worries that other clients would be



offended by the outlandish nature of the burial. They finally relented after weeks of negotiations, but insisted that the burial be private, and that the car be drained of fluids to protect the environment. "George wanted to go out in style, and, indeed, now he will," commented Swanson's lawyer in a report from The Associated Press. "We agree that this is rather elaborate, but really it's no different than being buried in a diamond-studded or gold coffin."

According to the AP, Swanson's widow, Caroline, transported her husband's ashes to the cemetery on the seat of her own white 1993 Corvette. The ashes were then placed on the driver's seat of his 10-year-old car, which had only 27,000 miles on the odometer. Inside the car, mourners also placed a lap quilt made by a group of women from Swanson's church, a love note from his wife and an Engelbert Humperdinck tape in the cassette deck, with the song "Release Me" cued up and ready to play. The license plate read "HI-PAL," which was Swanson's go-to greeting when he didn't remember a name. As 50 mourners looked on, a crane lowered the Corvette into a 7-by-7-by-16-foot hole.

"George always said he lived a fabulous life, and he went out in a fabulous style," Caroline Swanson said later. "You have a lot of people saying they want to take it with them. He took it with him."

Laying Her Down for a Long Winter's Nap!

Ask 100 different car-people how to store a car for the winter and you'll get 100 different methods from practical to paranoid.

I'm a formally A.S.E. certified mechanic and managed dealership service departments for over ten years and this came up every year for customers storing cars.

I check forums for new tips and tricks but it's mostly all the same common sense methods. Depending on how cold it is outside or climate

controlled your storage space is, some of these will matter more.

• Fluids

- Oil: Change it. People debate over how corrosive dirty oil is. An oil change is cheap insurance.
- Coolant: Make sure the mix is correct and it's been properly maintained
- Windshield Washer: Make sure it's not water
- Fuel: <u>Fill</u> the tank. Before you fill it, add the appropriate amount of "Stabil" fuel stabilizer. Get it at auto parts stores and Home Depot (with mowers, chain saws, etc).
- All other fluids: if you're maintaining at proper intervals, no worries.

• **Tires**: Few schools of thought here. People will put car up on jack-stands: great for long/years of storage but for a few months, no need for jack stands. I've never had a problem with flat-spots. Make sure, however, they're inflated to max PSI.

• **Battery**: Use a battery tender for computerized cars (C4 and up). Disconnect for non-computer electronics (C3-1) but you'll need it connected and with a battery tender if you've added any electronic accessories like an alarm, stereo, etc. Some people will swear they've let their car sit for months without a battery tender without any problem. I've never had that experience. Two-three weeks and my battery is dead in my C6 and my metal cars.

• **Mice**: Don't let them drive the car. Keep them out with dryer sheets inside the car and moth balls in netting bags in your engine compartment and around the car. If you eat in your car (Stop it!) vacuum out the crumbs. Good idea to also plug your exhaust with some rags.

• **Rising moisture**: Park your car over a plastic tarp. Why? In an enclosed space, moisture can rise from concrete and settle on your under chassis, suspension, etc. More important for older cars.

• **Car cover**: If your car is being stored outside, don't skimp. A cheap car cover or a tarp (eek!) will ruin your paint. Some people will cover their cars when inside to keep dust off. A bit OCD, but ok. Get a California Brush instead. It's way less work.

• **Starting car occasionally**: Unless you can drive it or let it run and rev it, don't. Moisture builds in the exhaust, sits there and will rot the exhaust from the inside out. If you do plan to start it, leave yourself a note on the dash about the exhaust rags!

• Wash/wax: Not really necessary but you can zoom out in the spring looking awesome!
