

4-Door Corvette!!

I've spent a lot of time up in Maine and am always amazed at not only it's natural beauty with its rocky shorelines, majestic mountains, and beautiful beach side communities but the creative craftsman and what they produce.

While attending the Back-to-the-Beach Corvette weekend in Old Orchard Beach I came upon this Corvette stretched to 4 Doors.



The closer that I looked at this creation the more I was impressed with it. The craftsmanship was flawless. The car was created by using only Corvette parts, assembled from different cars that were either wrecks or worn out.

The base car is a 75 or 76 while the rear looks to be from a 68-72. The owner/builder told me that the engine is a 1970 350HP mated to a later year TH 400 transmission. The car is equipped with many optional accessories including air conditioning, power windows on all four doors, tilt and telescoping wheel, power steering and standard Corvette brakes.



The car looked as clean and perfect both underneath and above and looked like it was assembled by the Corvette factory.



It looked better than the factory assembled Corvettes from that era. The door and fender lines were perfect as was the paint finish. He told me that the car drives with a smooth controlled ride.

The builder is a Corvette mechanic and did all the work himself and it took over a year to construct.

After a lot of research, I purchased a model from IKON Motorsports that had many great reviews. Its ABS and available pre-painted to match, though, I chose Matte Black. It was only \$160 and arrived very well packed and protected.





After some careful measuring, marking the installation area, and then cleaning with rubbing alcohol, the actual installation took 5 minutes. Chrissie helped my by holding up one side so the 2-sided tape didn't contact the surface until I had it properly in place. The 3M tape is super strong so its not going anywhere!



I also ordered new plates: Mass Fallen Heroes.


