



Members met at the Walpole Ace Hardware store parking lot at 8.30 so that we could all cruise in together. The invitation to the show was from member Jim Gable's granddaughter Sara who is a senior at the school and one of the event's coordinators.



The school opened the campus for visitors to view the amazing work the students do there. My tour leader was my wife Katrina, a graduate of the school class of



1980. Together we explored the beautiful campus. She told me that the

grounds are maintained by the students on machinery that they maintain, and from what I saw, in excellent working order. The class-

rooms are augmented with labs for students to work practically in their field of study. One of the "labs" was a small engine repair shop. Another, a machine shop, while still another a welding shop all stocked with modern and not so modern equipment. Blacksmithing is still taught there as part of the metal working program. The projects on display were everything that gets a gear head like me excited.

Beyond the classrooms are stables for animal husbandry. Katrina told me many of our veterinarians are Aggie grads. The farming part of the program offers a solid educational background for those who still seek to own or work in that necessary industry.

One of the most gratifying parts of our visit was the students. I have



to say I have never seen a group of more enthusiastic young men and woman. Without exception every one of the students couldn't wait to tell us about their experiences at their school. From Freshmen who couldn't wait to be eligible to the work/study program, to Seniors anticipating their new careers or further education, the excitement of the campus has left a lasting impression. 

The other part was space for the equipment and then maintenance; tune-ups, mixing 2stroke, Stabil for the winter, repairs, etc. I know you know!

Well, being a consultant gives me a lot of flexibility with my schedule, but I got rid of all my gas powered gear many years.

Then, Costco had a sale on electric 80V lawn equipment. Yup, 80V! I thought long and hard about plunging back into yard work, but decided to add the extra steps to my Fitbit. To seal my fate, I sent a picture of the mower to my Landscaper. He never replied.

I bought the 21" power-propelled mower, string trimmer and 730CFM (you read that right) blower. The mower folds up and stores flat against the wall (outstanding), and came with 2 batteries so I had 4 batteries and three chargers. This would all make the Tool Man proud!

It takes about an hour to cut my lawn. So far the batteries (2 in the mower) make it through on one charge with plenty of juice left. Mower has a meter. The batteries are warranted for eight years through Costco. Did I mention that I love Costco!
