MOST IMPORTANT HIGHLIGHTS

- 1st offense – \$100 fine.
- 2nd offense – \$250 fine, plus mandatory completion of a distracted driving educational program. (Expensive)
- 3rd and subsequent offenses – \$500 fine, plus insurance surcharge and mandatory completion of distracted driving educational program.

What Law Means:

- Not allowed** to touch device for texting, emailing, apps, video, or internet use.
- Cannot** touch phone except to activate the hands-free mode and can only enable when the device is installed or properly mounted to the windshield, dashboard, or center console in a manner that does not impede the operation of the motor vehicle.
- Handheld use **is allowed only** if the vehicle is both stationary **and** not located in a public travel lane or a bicycle lane. **Usage is NOT allowed at red lights or stop signs.**

Drivers under 18 are not allowed to use **ANY** electronic devices. All phone use while driving **is illegal**, including use in hands-free mode.

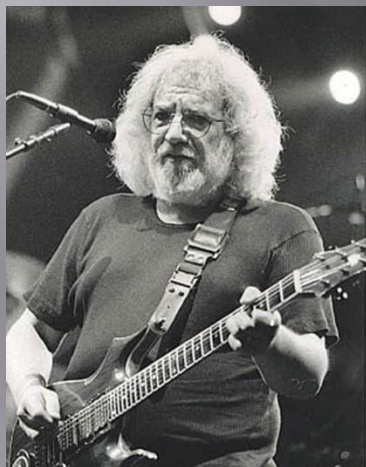
A Long Journey

I don't know when my love affair with cars began. My family was in the fire business, a big Goodyear dealer, and my earliest memories are of going to work with my dad on Saturdays and playing around the fires. Through the years I worked there on weekends and during school vacations. After college, I became a full time employee.



As far back as I can remember, I always liked vehicles. On our way to work, we would drive by Cycle Craft, now Boston Harley-Davidson, and I would drool looking at the Electra Glides parked out in front. Sometime in my early teens, I saw a midyear Vette parked in a neighbor's driveway. Whenever I walked by, I always thought "I'll bet he'll sell that someday." One sad day I was right - it was gone.

When it came time to buy my first car to commute back and forth to college I had my eye on a new AAR Cuda at the Chrysler-Plymouth dealer down the street. My family talked me out of such an "impractical" car and I settled on a new 1968 VW bug. I loved that car and washed it almost every day. I added mag wheels and bigger tires, removed the rear fenders and put on wider fiberglass one and made many other modifications.

Somewhere along the way, the fire business lost its charm. For fun, I had been taking evening classes in photography at the School of the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston. My instructors looked at what I was doing and told me "you could make a living at this." I figured they told all the students the same thing and blew it off. Eventually the world of parties and celebrities seemed like it might be a cool and fun career. So I took a leap of faith, thought for about a year, I didn't do very much. Slowly things started to click.

At first, I was staff photographer for a non-profit. Some local papers opened up and I became a freelancer for them and later did work for the Associated Press. There were a lot of pictures of school committee meetings, buildings, potholes, high school sports, etc. . Along the way, many famous people passed in front of my lens.

Some of the memorable ones were Frank Sinatra at Symphony Hall at a benefit for Tony Conigliaro, events at the stadium in Foxboro for the Rolling Stones, The Police, Simon and Garfunkel and others. I was also able to secure one-on-ones during publicity tours for many like Robert Duvall and John Travolta, and the last Boston appearance of the Grateful Dead among many others.



Fast forward about 40 years when I decided to retire. Within a few months of that decision, I started taking care of my elderly dad. One day in a conversation with him, he was 99 at the time, I was talking about Corvettes and he asked me "If not now, when?" The hunt was on.

I called local dealers but no one had what I wanted. There was an allocation system and the dealers made sales taking into account how many cars they were allocated. Then I Googled the largest Corvette dealer in the US and MacMulkin came up as the number two largest dealer. The number two Corvette dealer in New Hampshire...huh?

They informed me that they had two 2014 Corvettes coming in that weren't sold yet...a red and a white. They were both close to what I wanted. We reached a deal over the phone, I sent a \$3,000.00 deposit immediately to claim the car and send them the tracking number so they would know that it was on the way. I was at the post office 15 minutes later and my deposit was on the way. I wanted the WHITE one. Several days later MacMulkin called ... I was shocked to find out they sold the white one by mistake, but the red one was still available. Maybe all Corvettes are red but I wanted white. It was the end of the 2014 run and no new orders were being taken. After some more phone calls, we stuck and deal and I ordered a 2015. As they say, the rest is history.

This September will mark six awesome years with my C7. No regrets and a lot of smiles per mile. With the season starting in less than two months.

Track the Shipping of Your C8 Corvette On the Jack Cooper Transport Website

Did you know that you can track the shipping of your [C8 Corvette](#) on the Jack Cooper Transport website?

Thanks to CorvetteForum.com member *ChiTownVetteTech*, we have learned that it's possible to track any Corvette by VIN during shipping. I just checked mine and the shipping status shows "Pending."

Once you see your status, you can copy the Freight Build Number and search using that number to see all of the Corvettes that are on that particular manifest.

After your Corvette has been delivered, you can print a delivery receipt if you'd like one to keep.

To find the shipping status of your 2020 Corvette, go to <https://www.palsapp.com/>, then click on the search icon on the top right of the page (looks like a magnifying glass). Enter your VIN and click the search icon to the right of the input field.

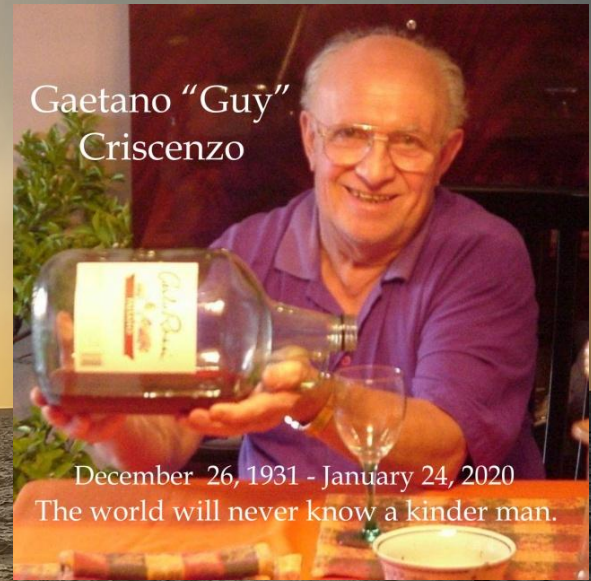
