
Winter Tips!

Now that the driving season is nearing an end most of us store our Corvettes for the winter season. For some of us we store our cars but leave open the option to drive them if the conditions are right. Still, we must take precautions to prevent issues when we recommission our cars in the spring.

We are all aware of taking precautions regarding fuel, stabilizing and filling it using top tier fuel before storage. Whether to fill to the brim or leave half full is up to the owner's preference. Our newer cars have sealed fueling systems but owners of older carburetor cars should fill the tank fully to prevent air from forming condensation that the alcohol will absorb, breaking down the fuel.





Battery maintenance should be addressed also. Either remove the battery or leave in place but attach a battery maintainer (not a trickle charger) to prolong the battery life.

Tires are one thing many owners don't attend to prior to storage. Fill the tires to the recommended pressure and I like to place a foam mat or pad under each tire to prevent flat spotting. I purchased a set of 4 foam pads from Ocean State Job Lot for \$13.00 that my tires rest on.

Putting your car away clean inside and out will make it easier to recommission the car when the driving season returns. That and it is so nice to have a clean car. I like to give one coat of wax at the end of the season, but this is just me.

Lastly rodents! Prevent rodents from nesting and damaging your car. This is especially important for those who store their car off site or in a storage building away from your house. Mice damage has become the number one issue with damaged electrical systems. This is especially true with General Motors cars because the coating around the wires is made of a soy product and mice like to eat the coating exposing bare wires to short or worse.

The simplest solution is to add dryer sheets to the inside areas of your car. This has proven to work but for me, I don't want my car to smell like perfume. I have found Botanical Rodent Repellent to work just as well as dryer sheets or other products. The bags smell like fresh cedar, (which is one of the ingredients) and each bag can be conveniently placed in the car. I like to put one in the trunk and one under the hood next to the battery (warmest part of the car during the winter) and so far, I have found no trace of mice. Either way, change out the dyer sheets or botanical bags each month to keep them fresh.

I also use two other products around the garage. Rodent Sheriff is mint oil that I spray around places mice might enter the garage. The doors especially. I don't recommend spraying this on the car. It is an oil and leaves a residue. Lastly, I use the old fashion method of leaving a few mouse traps baited with peanut butter near the car. Putting a car cover on is your choice. Personally, I like to look at my Corvette when I go to my garage, which I do daily.



Jeff Beck was a legendary pioneer and master of guitar techniques. I was fortunate enough to see him in 2022 just months before he passed at 78 in 2023.

Mr. Beck was also a car-guy who built many hotrods (pictured below) that he prized. He also loved Corvettes and owned many. Among them were a 1963 split window, '59 (pictured), and 2007 Z06.

"With my first sum of money – about £3,500 – I went straight out and bought a '63 split-window small block Corvette... I had to have it."

About his 2007 Corvette Z06: "It does 0-60 in 3.7 seconds and has a top speed of 198mph. It's like a hurricane on wheels. It's ridiculous," sighed Beck happily.
