



Lemon Blueberry Layer Cake!

Ingredients

1/2 cup (8 Tbsp; 113g) unsalted butter, softened to room temperature

- 1 and 1/4 cups (250g) granulated sugar
- 1/2 cup (100g) packed light brown sugar
- 6 Tablespoons (90ml) vegetable oil, canola oil, or avocado oil
- 4 large eggs, at room temperature
- 1 Tablespoon pure vanilla extract
- 3 cups (375g) all-purpose flour (spooned & leveled)
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 cup (180ml) buttermilk, at room temperature
- 2 Tablespoons lemon zest
- 1/2 cup (120ml) lemon juice (3–4 lemons), at room temperature
- 1 and 1/2 cups (210g) fresh blueberries (I do not recommend frozen)
- 1 Tablespoon all-purpose flour

Cream Cheese Frosting

- 8 ounces (226g) full-fat brick cream cheese, softened to room temperature*
- 1/2 cup (8 Tbsp; 113g) unsalted butter, softened to room temperature
- 3 and 1/2 cups (420g) confectioners' sugar
- 1 Tablespoon (15ml) heavy cream*
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- pinch salt

Instructions

Preheat oven to 350°F (177°C). Grease three 8-inch round cake pans, line with parchment paper rounds, then grease the parchment paper.

- 1. **Make the cake:** Using a handheld or stand mixer with a paddle attachment, beat the butter on high until smooth and creamy, about 1 minute. Add granulated and brown sugars and beat on medium-high speed until combined, about 2 minutes. Add the oil and beat until combined and light and creamy, about 3 more minutes. Add the eggs and vanilla, and beat on medium speed until everything is completely combined, about 1 minute. Scrape down the sides and bottom of the bowl as needed.
- 2. In a large bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, baking soda, and salt. Add the dry ingredients to the wet ingredients. Beat on low speed for a few seconds, then beat in the milk, lemon zest, and lemon juice *just* until combined. Toss the blueberries with 1 Tablespoon of flour and gently fold into the batter. Batter is thick. Do not over-mix.
- 3. Spoon batter evenly into prepared cake pans. Bake for about 22–26 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Remove from the oven and allow to cool completely in the pan before assembling and frosting.
- 4. **Make the frosting:** Using a handheld or stand mixer with a paddle attachment, beat cream cheese and butter together on medium speed until no lumps remain, about 3 full minutes. Add confectioners' sugar, heavy cream, vanilla extract, and salt with the mixer running on low. Turn mixer up to high speed and beat for 3 minutes.
- 5. **Assemble and frost:** First, using a large serrated knife, slice a thin layer off the tops of the cakes to create a flat surface. Place 1 layer on your cake stand. Evenly cover the top with cream cheese frosting. Top with 2nd layer, more frosting, then the third layer. Top with frosting and spread around the sides. The recipe doesn't make a ton of frosting, just enough for a light frost. Top with blueberries or lemon garnish if desired. Refrigerate for at least 45 minutes before cutting or else the cake may fall apart as you cut.
- 6. Cover leftover cake tightly and store in the refrigerator for up to 5 days.

Baseball and a Corvette!

Bobby Richardson, the legendary New York Yankees second baseman, received a sleek two-door Chevy Corvette as a prize from Sport Magazine for his exceptional performance in the 1960 World Series, where he became the only player ever to win the MVP award while playing on the losing team. His outstanding play included setting a record with 12 RBIs in the series and batting .367 against the Pittsburgh Pirates.


However, with a growing family—including three children at the time—Richardson found the sporty two-seater impractical. He soon traded the Corvette along with his station wagon for a Jeep and a new station wagon to accommodate his family better.

Interestingly, about a year after selling it, he purchased the same Corvette back from an Oldsmobile dealership, though the car had been driven for 9,000 miles by another user.

This Corvette's story mirrors Richardson's practicality and family-oriented values amid a highly successful professional career highlighted by five Gold Gloves and multiple All-Star appearances. His Corvette has since become a cherished part of his personal history, reflecting a balance between his life on the diamond and off it.

Today, Richardson's 1960 World Series MVP award and his Corvette remain symbols of a unique chapter in baseball history, illustrating not only his talent but also his outlook as a family man.

Being a fan of both Corvettes and the New York Yankees (sorry Red Sox fans), I never forgot this story.

No More Button Wall: 2026 Vette Gets Revamped!

Technically speaking, you could say 2026 marks a mid-cycle refresh for the Chevrolet Corvette. Nothing notable changes out the outside, save for some color choices. On the inside, it's a different story.

Chevrolet listened to customers, and now we have the first official look at the new two-seater cockpit. Right off the bat, you'll notice the controversial spine of buttons is gone. The climate controls are relocated to a horizontal strip on the dash, just above the center console and below the central climate vent. The spine itself is actually still there, but it isn't nearly prominent and now serves as a grab-handle for the passenger.

You'll also notice a lot more digital real estate. The center screen stretches further across the dash and grows to 12.7 inches in size. The driver faces a new 14.0-inch digital screen, and to the left of





Other aesthetic changes include a revamped center console with new cupholders. The drive mode selector is repositioned in line with the gear selector, freeing up space for a wireless phone charger. There are new interior trim and color options, including an asymmetrical option available in Jet Black and Adrenaline red to separate driver and passenger sides. You can even opt for different colored seats if you so choose. There are some tech upgrades for the 2026 Corvette, too. The most interesting is a new mode for the familiar Performance Traction Management system called PTM Pro. In short, it pretty much turns all the assists off—traction, stability, you name it. The only thing left running is the anti-lock brake system, and on the E-Ray, front axle controls. It's available on all trim levels, including the 1,064-horsepower ZR1. That should make the car quite the ride, if you're brave enough.

The E-Ray Performance App is now available on all trim levels, and the Performance Data Recorder is upgraded to work better with the larger screens. Naturally, those screens are all customizable to the driver's choosing, and if you want to load your choice Spotify playlist from your phone, Apple CarPlay and Android Auto are still available.

Only hardcore 'Vette connoisseurs will identify 2026 models from the outside. Hardtop models have a new electrochromic roof that has adjustable tint settings for the glass. The E-Ray gets standard body-color rocker panels. Blue brake calipers are available for the E-Ray and Z06. A new asymmetrical center stripe is offered in red with carbon flash. Roswell Green Metallic and Blade Silver Metallic join the exterior color palette. And the only performance upgrade: ZR1s with the ZTK performance package get new brakes with massive 10-piston calipers in front, 6-pistons at the back, and ceramic discs all around.

"Corvette is the ultimate American sports car, which is why it has remained the luxury sport segment leader for more than 20 years—with the next competitor a distant second in terms of market share," said Scott Bell, vice-president of Chevrolet Global. "With these updates, the midengine Corvette will continue to cement its leadership for years to come."

Chevy isn't ready to talk pricing for the 2026 Corvette. Look for that information to come later this year.

Outsmart Hackers and Stay Safe Online!

How many accounts do you really have?

The average person has **20–100 online accounts**—from email and banking to shopping and Netflix.

The problem: Most people reuse the same password (or slight variations).

The risk: If one account is hacked, the rest are easy pickings. Rule #1: Every account deserves its own unique, strong password.

What makes a strong password?

X Myth: Adding "1" or "!" to the end of a weak password makes it secure.

✓ Truth: Length matters more than complexity.

That's why experts recommend **passphrases**—longer, memorable strings of words.

How to create a strong passphrase

Start with a sentence or phrase you'll remember.
 Add variety: uppercase + lowercase + numbers + symbols.
 Example

- Phrase: "Lets age with attitude!"
- Encoding: Capitalize words, swap a \rightarrow @, i \rightarrow 1
- Result: "Lets@geW1th@tt1tude!" (Don't actually use this one—it's just a demo!)

But how do I remember them all?

With 20–100 accounts, even the best passphrases are tough to track. Writing them on sticky notes or saving them in a file isn't secure.

Enter our hero: the Password Manager.

What's a password manager?

A password manager is a secure vault for all your logins.

You remember just one master password, and it does the rest.

What it does:

- Stores usernames + passwords safely
- Creates strong, unique passwords for you
- Autofills them when you log in

Warns you if a password is leaked

Mhy it's safe:

- Uses strong encryption
- Often requires two-factor authentication (a one-time code sent to your phone)

3 Golden Rules for Password Safety

- Unique passwords only. Don't let one hack open the door to all your accounts.
- Be careful on shared devices. Don't save passwords on a computer or phone that isn't yours. Always sign out.
- Protect your two most important logins:
- O Your main email
- O Your password manager account
 - √ Memorize them
 - √ Don't share them
 - √ Use two-factor authentication
 - ⟨→ Why? If someone hacks your email, they can reset almost every other password.

Repular password managers

- Google Password Manager → Free, built into Gmail
- iCloud Keychain → Free, built into Apple devices
- **1Password** → Paid, works on Android, Apple, and Windows

6 Bottom Line

You don't need to juggle 50 complicated passwords.

With strong passphrases, a good password manager, and smart habits, you'll stay a step ahead of hackers—and make your online life much safer (and less stressful).
