### Dial 911!

Most of you know that I spent 30 years as a Millis fire-fighter. My career saw many changes to the Emergency Medical System or EMS. Going from the town ambulance response was more "scoop and run" as quickly as possible to the ambulance crew being all trained Emergency Medical Technicians or EMT's where first response also included first aid.

In subsequent years hospitals provided an emergency response unit with trained paramedics that would intercept the ambulance and have a paramedic board the ambulance to start triage, insert an IV, and start com-



munications with the receiving hospital. Today, most if not all our towns and cities provide a direct, paramedic initial response through either their fire department, or a private contracted company. The importance of this response is to provide the most effective medical care during what responders and emergency room personnel call "The Golden Hour" where the chances of patient survival are greatest.

I am bringing this all up because I am asking all my friends and EMCC family to not dismiss using this important service. Most of us fall into the age group where a situation requiring medical intervention is required. All too often I hear friends who are suffering from an unknown medical condition rely on a family member or spouse to transport them to the emergency room. While a laceration that is bleeding but controlled doesn't necessarily require paramedic care, symptoms such as shortness of breath, dizziness, chest pain, unresponsiveness or a fall and inability to get up, trauma or a head strike all require immediate care.

Once the call is made, EMS starts. Responding personnel assessment, communication with the ER, and quick transport will have the necessary hospital personnel waiting for the patient and initial treatment having already begun in the ambulance. The critical Golden Hour finds the patient well on their way to a hopeful recovery.

It all starts with a call to 911. Don't hesitate to make it. Steve Campbell Millis Deputy Fire Chief (ret.)

### Recipe of the Month

### White Chocolate Cranberry Pecan Clusters by Timeless Recipes

#### Ingredients

- 2 cups white chocolate chips
- 1 cup dried cranberries
- 1 cup pecans, roughly chopped
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/4 teaspoon salt (optional)

#### **Directions:**

1. Melt the White Chocolate: In a microwave-safe bowl, melt the white chocolate chips in 30-second intervals, stirring in between until fully melted and smooth. Be careful not to overheat the chocolate.



- 2. Add the Mix-Ins: Stir in the chopped pecans, dried cranberries, vanilla extract, and salt (if using) until everything is well coated with the melted white chocolate.
- Form the Clusters: Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Drop spoon full of the mixture onto the sheet, forming clusters. You can make them as big or as small as you like.
- 4. Let Them Set: Allow the clusters to set at room temperature for about 1 hour, or place them in the refrigerator for 15-20 minutes to speed up the process.
- 5. Serve: Once the clusters are firm, they are ready to enjoy! Store any leftovers in an airtight container at room temperature or in the fridge.

#### The Secret of the Recipe

Adding a pinch of salt enhances the sweetness of the white chocolate and balances the tartness of the cranberries, creating the perfect sweet-and-salty flavor!

#### The Corvette Name Will Not Become it's Own Brand for GM

Several years ago, rumors surfaced that General Motors was considering making the Corvette name a sub-brand within its automotive empire. These rumors included the marketing of several different models bearing the Corvette name, including a sedan and an SUV, in addition to the traditional variants of the familiar sports car.

We don't know what's happened behind the scenes since then, but it appears that plan is dead and buried. During an episode of Jay Leno's Garage devoted to the new 2025 Corvette ZR1, GM president Mark Reuss ruled out the idea of the Corvette name becoming a brand in its own right.





Reuss thus confirmed that the Corvette will remain within the Chevrolet family, making the point that it embodies the very essence of the brand - the best of all worlds in terms of value for money, here in the case of a high-performance model.

Corvette badging on the Chevrolet Corvette ZR1 | Photo: Chevrolet Deliveries of the 2025 Corvette are due to start soon, but the ZR1 variant is not expected until next year. Prices haven't been announced, but considering the level of performance, we can expect it to be the most expensive model in the range. We can expect a price point somewhere between \$170,000 and \$225,000 in Canada.

Incredibly, the ZR1 variant could be eclipsed by another performance version. Test models have been spotted and could well be the Zora variant (named after one of the Corvette's fathers, Zora Arkus-Duntov), which would combine the 5.5L twin-turbo V8 of the ZR1 variant with the electric motor of the E-Ray hybrid variant.

The ZR1 version already offers 1,064 hp. It's hard to imagine how far this madness could go.




