



My thoughts on knowledge and wisdom...

Knowledge is an awareness, realization, or consciousness about a certain thing. Knowledge is only useful when *applied* in a meaningful way. *Wisdom* is the *application* of knowledge. It is good to know things, it is better to use wisdom. When we listen and follow the advice of the Holy Spirit, we reap the benefits of a rewarding, prosperous, and stress-reduced life.

Proverbs 1:7 says, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction (NKJV). We do well to couple this with verses like Ephesians 5:10, which says, "Carefully determine what pleases the Lord", and passages like James 1:22-25: "Be be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man observing his natural face in a mirror, for he observes himself, goes away, and immediately forgets what kind of man he was. Be he who looks into the perfect law of liberty and continues in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work, this one will be blessed in what he does."

We need both *knowledge* and *wisdom* to overcome wicked psychological schemes in this world. We should earnestly seek these things since God makes them available to everyone. We can have full confidence that He will give us good things when we ask according to His will (see James 1:5–8; 1 John 5:14–15).

God wants His creation to walk in light, knowledge, wisdom, and love. This kind of life will receive honor from mankind and a crown of glory when Jesus returns (see Proverbs 3:1-4 coupled with Colossians 3:1-4).


For a brief period of time, I was employed on an air force base and it was one of my best workplace experiences. Everyday at 5pm, the national anthem blared over an outdated amplification system.

It may seem unthinking about to cease praying for something you want, but that's kind of what


My Top-10 Wants/Desires in a Husband:

I have done. I'll explain why. I tapped into real contentment once I understood three things: 1) God already knew the person I was going marry;

2) I wasn't going to meet him any time soon; and 3) confidence in God's timing comes from learning to appreciate verses like Isaiah 55:8-9 and Proverbs 19:21.

Wanting something just to want it, or because everyone else has it, is not the formula for answered prayer. Trust me in this. I've spent years pondering 1 Corinthians 7 - whether single or married, I recommend studying this passage of Scripture. These verses laid a foundation for healthy solitude and helped me overcome all the pining and whining for a mate. Singlehood is an excellent phase of life when done the right way.



I highly recommend this book whether you're single or married!

About 10 years ago, I prayed, "Lord, show me the person I'm going to marry...I don't want to date while I wait." (Be careful what you pray for!!) To this day, I have not been on a legitimate - the man pays, opens doors, has good conversation, expects nothing in return - kind of date. I've gone through seasons where I admired so much of how Jesus and Paul accomplished great things as single people that I actually prayed for a supernatural gift of celibacy (I recommend all single people seek this out!).

In the English language "love" describes how we feel about coffee, our favorite song, and new shoes. The word is practically meaningless. In Greek, there are four words: agape (unconditional), eros (romance), storge (family), and phileo (brotherly/best friend). Agape is readily found among Christians; eros can wait; and if you heard my story, you would know storge simply wasn't meant to be.

Of all these, *phileo* is what I want most. I'm telling you, if I could be best friends with a guy and not develop *eros*, I would be 100% good with that. Think of phileo as intimacy (commitment, comfort, support) without sex. I'm not saying it's possible! - but if it was, I would be highly interested in making it work (I've probably been single too long, eh?).

I confess, I threw away my original top-10 list a long time ago; the list above only proves that I'm still looking for companionship (I think #3 and #10 shouldn't have to wait until marriage, but women are just...tough). Anyway, I'll be waiting...hopefully, I'm being transformed into a good wife and a better person in this process. I'm definitely content to remain single until that day!
