



Father's Message— "Our Spiritual Home"

Our personal home is safe and familiar. It is where we belong. Our Orthodox Christian Church is also our spiritual home. It is a place of prayer, comfort, spiritual healing, and celebration. We are at home in the fragrance of the incense, the sound of hymns and prayers, the physical touch of kneeling, bowing and making the sign of the cross, and the taste of Holy Communion and the blessed bread. You may have been brought to Church on your 40th day, or the Orthodox Church may have been the destination of your spiritual journey. For both, the Church is a spiritual home to which we may always return. We are brothers and sisters in Christ – a family. Our Church exists when the dispersed, divided, self-pre-occupied people unite and become a family, where people see one another as brothers and sisters with God as their common Father, and try to share whatever they have and whatever they are, and be united in heart and soul.

Our Church is so much more than a building. It is where we turn for comfort, support and healing. It is where we make true Christian friends that last a lifetime. No matter where we go in the world, we can come home to the Orthodox Church to be surrounded by the same familiar elements: altar, icon screen, pulpit, altar table, tabernacle, iconography, baptismal font, candles and more. Church is not so much a place as it is what we are together. We are called to be the Body of Christ to witness to God in the world. When we truly become members of the Church, transfigured by our faith and worship, we become what the Church was intended to be. We enter our spiritual home not to be entertained, but to be a part of a community of believers. We receive Jesus Christ in Holy Communion. As we pray, worship and serve together, we become His Body. To be truly a member of the Church as the Body of Christ requires our presence and our engagement with one another — in worship, study and service to others. We grow spiritually as a family. We give sacrificially as we acknowledge that all we have comes from God. "...in the Church we live eternal life starting from now. We do not simply await the life to come, but we experience and enjoy it from the present. The Kingdom of God is not life beyond the grave but communion with God now..."

From our spiritual home we are sent out as bearers of His light in the modern world, setting an example by our mutual understanding and love. As we do so, we pray for each other, listen and learn from each other, disagree respectfully, restore civility,

Every year during the month of November and December we collect canned foods and other non perishable items for the homeless and also collect coats and sweaters, scarves and gloves for those less fortunate than us. You can start bringing things this coming Sunday and leave your items at the bar area of the social hall. We will be collecting up until the last Sunday before Christmas. We will also be establishing a food pantry here at our Church for anyone who would need use during these difficult times.

Also our young adults have started a program whereby they prepare food on the last Friday of the month and take it on the last Saturday of each month to a place in Washington where food is distributed. If anyone would like to help with this effort, donations can be made through the Church website earmarked for homeless meals. It averages \$150-\$200 per month to prepare the food and take it to the facility in DC. Thank you for donating to this worthy cause and God bless everyone this Thanksgiving and Christmas season and always.

Parish Assembly Sunday, November 23, 2025

Pursuant to the regulations of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America and the Bylaws of the Greek Orthodox Church of Saint Theodore Lanham, Maryland, the date of the General Assembly meeting has been scheduled **for Sunday NOVEMBER 23, 2025**, following church services in Founder's Hall downstairs. According to Church By-Laws, those persons wishing to participate and vote must pay their Stewardship up to the date of the Assembly. A member of the Parish who is already enrolled in the Parish but has to pay his/her stewardship may pay the same day and before the beginning of the Assembly

All members of the Community are urged to attend this Parish Assembly, because of its importance. It is also our obligation as members of St.Theodore to come and offer our support for the progress of the church. Your presence is needed to establish a quorum.

CANDIDACY FORM FOR PARISH COUNCIL

All (11) positions for the parish council re-open as of January 1, 2026 and the term of office is for two years, 2026 and 2027. Those currently serving on the council may place their names in for another two years. Parishioners who have not served before or served many years ago, can also place their names for the council however please note: In accordance with the Uniform Parish Regulations, "A candidate for the Parish Council must be a parishioner in good standing of the Parish for at least one (1) year immediately preceding the date of the election and must live his or her life in accordance with the Faith and canons of the Church. The Priest determines whether the Parishioners are in canonical and financial good standing." We urge parishioners in good standing who have the willingness, ability, and time to serve the church to submit this form anytime beginning today until the beginning of the Parish Assembly. You can also be present at the Assembly, on November 23, 2025, and be nominated at that time. Nominations will close at the General Assembly.
