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

THE MEANING OF COMMUNITY

Many years ago there was a monastery that had fallen on hard times. Once a great monastery, it had dwindled in numbers to only five monks: the abbot and four others, all over 70 years of age. As the abbot agonized over the closing of his monastery, it occurred to him that he ought to pay a visit to a wise elder and ask him if he could offer any advice that might save the monastery. One day he ventured to the hut and explained the purpose of his visit to the elder. The abbot pleaded with the elder to give him some advice that might save his monastery. "I am sorry," exclaimed the elder, "I have no advice to give. The only thing I can tell you is that the Messiah is one of you."

Upon returning to the monastery, his fellow monks asked if the elder had given him any advice. "Unfortunately," the abbot informed them, "he could not help. The only thing he did say was that the Messiah is one of us. I don't know what he meant." In the days and weeks, and months that followed the old monks pondered and wondered what was the significance, if any, of the elder's words. The Messiah is one of us? Could he possibly have meant one of us monks here at the monastery? If that is the case, which one of us is it? As they contemplated in this manner, the old monks began to treat each other with extraordinary respect with the chance that one among them might be the Messiah.

Additionally, each monk treated himself with extraordinary respect thinking that in fact he was the Messiah. Little by little this extraordinary respect grew and radiated far beyond the walls of the monastery. People began to visit the monastery more frequently. Then it happened. Some of the younger men who visited the monastery started to talk more and more with the older monks. After some time, one man asked if he could join their order. Then another joined and then another. So, within a few years the monastery again became a thriving order of spirituality, thanks to the elder's gift of wisdom. The profound gift that afforded this group of monks the opportunity to live in a setting characterized by the virtue that is so frequently overlooked. The elder's gift, a gift that instilled respect, understanding, commitment, inclusivity, safety, wisdom and love. The gift re-established their community.

Community is hard to define as a term and even more difficult to maintain as an ideal, yet we apply it to nearly every collection of individuals - a town, an academic institution, and a church, such as our beloved church of St. Theodore. But reality lets us know that it is difficult to keep the church always moving forward. It is a real challenge. When people come together, they can be a diverse group of individuals. However, in God's eyes, there exists no distinction whatsoever with regards to age, profession, sex, race, or language. For the one common denominator that we have that allows us to transcend all of these differences is the common Orthodox Faith that we proclaim.

Yet there are still problems in every community. One of the biggest threats to a community is judgement. It is an act of pronouncing a decision and it is the justification by which we either include or exclude someone. Judgement is the greatest enemy to any community and we must always be vigilant about this. As St. John writes, "All judgement has been left to the Son of God." By passing judgement upon one another we make ourselves an enemy to the worshipping community. Individuals who are exclusive are not allies but enemies to the community. Therefore, it is logical to conclude that the true meaning of community is inclusiveness. Just as in the story of the monks and their monastery, inclusiveness is a fundamental principle that sustains a community.

As Orthodox Christians we are called to imitate Christ throughout our lives. We are called to "make disciples of all nations..." We are called to be good stewards of God's creation. Our efforts of sustaining our Church of St. Theodore can only be achieved in a cooperative effort with God and with one another. This can only be done when we commit ourselves to Christ and radiate His love. And through love, we remain committed to inclusivity. We love our neighbor and hate the sin. We do not judge others in the community, but pray for them, with them and yes, care for them. This is the means by which the monks in the monastery were able to transcend their divisions and establish a revitalized community. When we separate ourselves from our fellow parishioners, the more problems we will find and have. When we draw closer to one another by transcending our divisions, we ultimately come nearer to God. And when we advance towards God to the point that we have centered our lives in His virtues, then we have truly established a Community that is centered in Jesus Christ and it will thrive until our Lord returns for us.
