“AXIOS” to His Eminence, Metropolitan Apostolos of New Jersey

I share with you my thoughts and sentiments of the Enthronement of His Eminence, Metropolitan Apostolos of New Jersey on Saturday, September 16th. In many places in Greece but especially on the island of Karpathos of the Dodecanesian Islands, we have a tradition of singing to the bride and groom individually as they meet in the front of the church on their wedding day. It's traditionally with two musical instruments, one called a lyra and the other called a “laouto” and the people sing “mantinades” or poetic verses dedicated to the groom and the bride and their nuptials. When Metropolitan Apostolos, along with His Eminence, Archbishop Elpidophoros of America, arrived at the Metropolitan Cathedral of St. John the Theologian in Tenafly, New Jersey, they were greeted by the sounds of the island of Karpathos—of the lyra and laouto and the young man with the lyra leaned his head back and sang out blessings and congratulations in the form of “mantinades” the sung poetry of Karpathos.

“Συγχαρητήρια θα πω για την ενθρόνιση σου,
Κι' ανώτερες προαγωγές να δεις εις την ζωή σου
