Farragut Changed Command 6SEPT2017 as Irma Neared

Guided-missile destroyer USS Farragut (DDG 99) held a change of command ceremony on 6SEPT2017 during which CDR Casey C. Baker relieved CDR Megan A. Thomas.

Thomas served as XO during Farragut's 2014 **Bold Alligator Operations** and the 2015 deployment with the Theodore Roosevelt Carrier Strike Group. While deployed to the 5th Fleet AOR, Farragut successfully ensured freedom of navigation, rescued three stranded fisherman on a disabled boat in the Red Sea, as well as supporting maritime security and **Operation Inherent** Resolve. She then assumed duties as Farragut's C.O. in March 2016. During Thomas' tenure as Captain, Farragut participated in Fleet Week New York 2016, completed a strenuous Maintenance Phase including a Docking Selected Restricted Availability, and fully certified during the Basic Phase to ensure Farragut will be ready for future deployments.

Farragut was awarded Four Command Excellence Awards and the 2016 Retention Excellence Award while Thomas had command.

"I've been extremely fortunate to serve among such a tremendous group of professionals including the numerous entities that support our operations, from maintenance to training, but it is the memories of the dedicated Officers, Chiefs and Crew of USS Farragut that have made a lifelong impact on me and for which I am truly humbled and grateful," reflected Thomas.

Friends and family were in attendance for the change of command ceremony which took place in the pilot house of Farragut. The ceremony had to be moved up a day in advance of Hurricane Irma. CAPT David Maxey, Commander SURFRON 14, who served as the guest speaker, praised Thomas for her successful tours on board Farragut.

Baker takes command of Farragut after serving as the XO since FEB2016. He is originally from Dallas, TX and earned his commission through the USMMA at Kings Point, NY in 1994. His first sea tour was aboard USS Caron (DD 970) as the DCA, followed by a tour aboard USS Ramage (DDG 61) as the Fire

Control Officer. As a Department Head, he served as the CHENG onboard USS Nitze (DDG 94) and then as the N4 at Destroyer Squadron (DESRON) 26.

Ashore, Baker served at the Joint Deployable Assessment Team (JDAT), the Tactical **Document Media** Exploitation Team -Afghanistan (TACDOMEX-A, and at the Patrol Coastal Squadron (PCRON) One as the Operations and Plans Officer. Cmdr. Baker earned a Masters in Public Administration from Regent University and a Masters in Strategic Studies from the Air War College.

When asked about his thoughts as he faces command, Baker explained "I am deeply honored at receiving the chance to command Farragut and her fantastic crew."

Farragut is continuing local operations, preparing for a future deployment. She will enter an integrated phase with Carrier Strike Group 8 later this year. The crew of Farragut thanks Thomas for memorable and successful years under her leadership and wish her and her family fair winds and following seas.

We are a not -for-profit organization incorporated in Florida dedicated to preserving the honored traditions of service exemplified by our Hero. Admiral David G. Farragut (-1899). News from Farragut's Commanding Officer, CDR Casey Baker

Happy New Year's Farragut Shipmates!

I hope the holiday season treated you all well and this letter finds you in good health and spirits. The current *Farragut* (DDG 99) and her crew have been very busy this past year.

The ship underwent a successful Engineering Light-Off Assessment following the 2016 drydocking, into a jampacked basic phase throughout the spring. After certifying, we got underway and sailed up to Bristol, RI where the crew marched in the oldest continuous Fourth of July celebration in the country. We returned home for a brief stay in-port, which

was cut short by Hurricane Irma. We conducted a quick change of command ceremony on September 6th in which **CDR Casey Baker** relieved CDR Megan Thomas. The next day all of the ships in the Mayport Basin were instructed to get underway to head to Norfolk to wait out the storm. We returned to Mayport a few weeks later, made some quick preps, and got back underway on Columbus Day weekend for our Group Sail with all of the other ships in the Harry S. Truman Carrier Strike Group. Following a successful month-long group sail, and supporting the Iwo Jima Amphibious

Readiness Group COMPTUEX, Farragut returned to Mayport. The crew put in a lot of hard work and effort to make repairs throughout the ship in anticipation of Mid-Cycle Inspection, which resulted in an overall score of "Green" and above average marks for this ship.

Leading into the New Year, the crew is getting ready for our COMPTUEX with the Truman Strike Group to prepare for our Spring Deployment. We hope all is well with all of our Farragut Shipmates and that we all enjoy a Happy New Year.

Our Homecoming 2018 Keynote Speaker FORCM (AW/SW) Bob Conklin

Force Master Chief (SW/AW) Bob Conklin hails from Paterson, NJ where he enlisted in the USNR on 14July1969. He attended recruit training at RTC. Great Lakes. IL and later graduated from DC "A" School, Naval Damage Control Training Center, Philadelphia, PA.

In 1970 he reported for active duty onboard USS WILLIAM C LAWE (DD 763). During his tour on LAWE, he advanced to DC2. In 1972, he returned to the drilling reserve and served with Ship's Maintenance and Repair Unit 2202, Jersey City, NJ advancing to DC1. In 1975, he transferred to FTG 4414, Southfield, MI.

Returning to active duty in 1976, he was a recruiter at Navy Recruiting District, Newark, NJ. Reenlisting in the USN in 1980, he returned to sea and served in USS SEMMES (DDG 18), homeport Charleston, SC, qualifying as an **Enlisted Surface Warfare** Specialist (ESWS) and JOOD (underway) and was advanced to HT1. He split toured to USS CONOLLY (DD 979) in 1982, where he was selected as a HTC and later served as CONOLLY'S DCA.

In 1985, he reported to Damage Control School, Fleet Training Center, Norfolk, as the Senior Instructor and Curriculum Model Manager for the Afloat Safety Officer and Safety Petty Officer courses. In addition to the

Safety courses, he also qualified to instruct the General Damage Control, Repair Party (BUTTERCUP) and **DCPO** Maintenance courses. While at DC School he was designated a Master Training Specialist by the Chief of NAVEDTRA and was advanced to DCCS.

In 1988, he reported aboard USS SAIPAN (LHA 2) after graduating from the Senior Enlisted Academy at Newport, Rhode Island, Class 32. Aboard SAIPAN he served as Engineering **Department Leading Chief** Petty Officer, Repair Division LCPO, Fire Marshal and Ballast Officer.

In 1990, he was advanced to HTCM and selected as a Command Master Chief (CMC). Staying at sea, his first CMC tour was in USS CONOLLY (DD 979).

In 1992, he was selected as CMC of USS **DWIGHT D** EISENHOWER (CVN 69). In 1994 he was selected as the Force Master Chief, Naval Surface Force, U.S. Atlantic Fleet.

Returning to sea again in 1997, he reported to USS BARRY (DDG 52). He was only on board one week when he was handpicked by the Type Commander to fill an unplanned loss aboard USS BATAAN (LHD 5), assuming the duties as CMC on October 6, 1997. **During BATAAN'S first** cruise, he qualified as **Enlisted Aviation Warfare**

Specialist (EAWS).

In 2001 he reported to Strike Fighter Squadron 15 as Command Master Chief and was embarked onboard USS ENTERPRISE (CVN 65) on September 11th. Returning from Operation Enduring Freedom in November 2001, he was selected to be the Command Master Chief of the Navy's newest aircraft carrier, USS RONALD REAGAN (CVN 76) in construction at Newport News Shipbuilding. On 14 April 2004, CMC Conklin was relieved of his duties and reported to Commander, Naval Air Force Atlantic where he served as until his retirement on 1SEPT2004 after 35 years of Naval Service.

A 1994 graduate of the **Defense Equal Opportunity** Management Institute, Force Master Chief Conklin earned an AS Degree in General Studies from Mohegan Community College and a B.A. degree in Human Relations Management from Golden Gate University, graduating Summa cum Laude.

His personal awards include the Meritorious Service Medal (four awards), Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal, Navy Good Conduct Medal (six awards), Naval Reserve Meritorious Service Medal (two awards), National Defense Service Medal (3 awards) and 23 other service, campaign and unit awards.

Force Master Chief Conklin and his wife Kathleen have been married for 45 years. They have 2 daughters and 4 grandchildren.
