# Lantern Award given out at Patriots' Day dinner



#### Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Challenge for May 2025

He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" (Gospel for May 4, Jn 21:17a)

When, following the Resurrection, Jesus revealed himself to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias, why did he ask Peter three times whether he loved him? It has often been seen as a penance for Peter's earlier threefold denial of Christ. But perhaps there's something more, perhaps Jesus was pushing Peter to reflect more deeply on what it means to love him. Sometimes, we speak the words "I love you" by rote, without grasping their true meaning. May we always be mindful of what it means to truly love someone and to love as Christ taught us. Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori: This month, I challenge you to identify one way you can demonstrate true love of God and neighbor. Then pray about how to concretely undertake that sacrificial act of love — and put into action.

#### Copy of Resolutions sent to Mass K of C April 2, 2025

#### RESOLUTION TO AMEND GUIDELINES FOR CHARITY GRANTS

WHEREAS in this age of very rapid advances in technology, it now would be appropriate to amend the Charity Fund Guidelines, to enable us to serve a greater range of people in need, with a greater variety of charitable services.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the restriction of "children with physical handicaps who have not reached their 20th birthday" be changed to read: "persons with physical handicaps, regardless of age". This would enable us to assist persons who have lost the use of limbs or have otherwise become handicapped as adults and do not have insurance assistance (e.g. modifying a vehicle for a newly handicapped person to be able to legally operate.)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, to increase the maximum grant amounts, in keeping with increased costs: Wheelchair ramps to \$8,000, stair lifts and service dogs to \$8,000, wheelchair van conversions to \$10,000, and \$7,000 for any other covered item.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, to remove the restriction on "computer type hardware" in paragraph 7. This would allow for such items as text to voice translation, as well as hearing and visual assists that are becoming reality with advances in AI technology.

The intent of this resolution is to enable Knights of Columbus charities to be able to serve a greater community of persons with both physical and intellectual handicaps.

#### RESOLUTION TO DISTRIBUTE STATE CHARITY FUNDS

WHEREAS it has been shown that at the end of the Fiscal year ending on April 30, 2024, the State Charity Fund has net assets in excess of 5 million dollars. Income to the Fund regularly exceeds expenditures and grants, thereby fueling this buildup. A distribution from this fund would enable local councils to have an immediate Charitable impact.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that approximately 35% of the Fund's accumulated assets to date, be returned to the councils located in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts that are in GOOD STANDING as of April 30, 2025. This distribution is to be used ONLY FOR CHARITABLE PURPOSES as may be determined by each individual council and must be spent for said purposes within 9-months of receipt of the distribution. Distribution(s) to be reported on form 10784-0 8/23 with appropriate notation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Distribution be as follows:

To each of the councils that contributed to the Tootsie Roll Drive during the past fiscal year, the sum of \$10,000. To each of the remaining councils, the sum of \$2,000. This would constitute a distribution of approximately \$1,850,000. Said distributions to be made within 90 days of adoption of this resolution.

Adoption of this resolution is in keeping with the admonishments in Leadership Resources for councils to NOT maintain large balances, except in special circumstances. By putting approximately one-third of the Charity Fund Assets back into the hands of the local individual councils, the ability to have a significant impact on our commitment to CHARITABLE activity at a more local level will be greatly enhanced. = = = = =
