Knights of Columbus stand in solidarity with our priests and religious.



2,000 cans of tuna fish sought as donation for Food for Families

Tuna fish in a can meets the need of protein in a very portable package.

For the last three years, the Bishop Ruocco council 9275 in Chelmsford, has donated more than 1,000 cans of name-brand tuna fish each year to Lazarus House Ministries of Lawrence, MA and surrounding communities. This is a godsend for families with food insecurity issues.

This year, an anonymous donor has offered to match the first 250 cans.

Martha's food pantry of Lazarus House serves 1,883 guests in the surrounding towns with weekly food packages (as of October 2024). The Knights of Columbus council further supports the tuna fish donation with more than S1,500 in supermarket gift cards.
