Currency: Rupee. 84 to US\$1.

















































































# The Caste System Between 1860 and 1920:

#### **Today**


Although illegal, the caste system is still widely accepted for marriages, jobs, friendships, etc.

- We did that in the city of Madurai.



























































































































































































































1497-99: Portuguese explorer Vasco da Gama landed.

Established a settlement.

1524: Da Gama's third visit to Goa. He died on this visit.

1947: India got independence from Britain. Demanded Portugal return Goa to India. Portugal refused.

**1961:** Indian army invaded and annexed Goa.


































**Mumbai** – Formerly Bombay.
