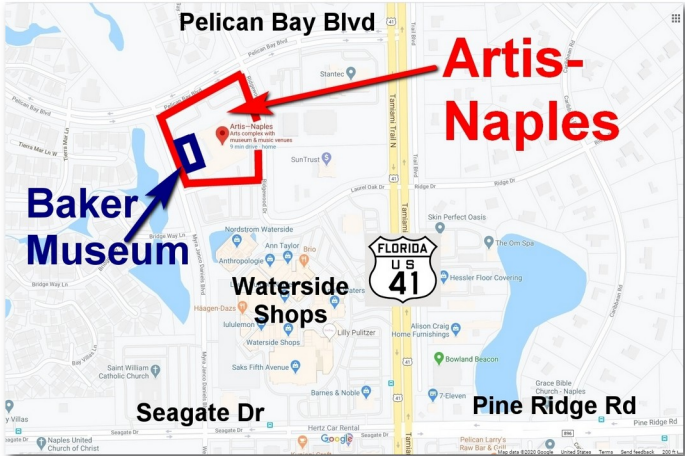

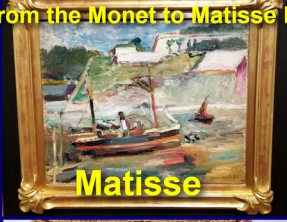
Monet to Matisse

Monet to Matisse: French Masterworks from the Dixon Gallery and Gardens is an exhibition comprised of stunning works by some of the world's best-known artists, including Claude Monet, Edward Degas, Pierre-Auguste Renoir, Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec and Camille Pissarro. In addition to works by these Impressionist artists, the exhibition will feature major paintings by Post-Impressionist masters Henri Matisse, Paul Cézanne, Paul Gauguin, Marc Chagall and Georges Braque. For this exhibition, the Dixon is loaning more than 70 objects derived from the core of its permanent collection.

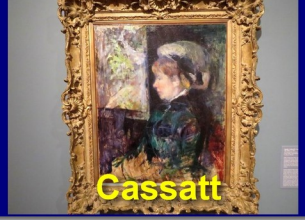

Dawn's Forest

The Sculpture of Louise Nevelson

Dawn's Forest is Louise Nevelson's largest, most complex environmental sculpture and her last major work.

Created in the artist's signature assemblage style, the monumental sculpture is made of various white-painted abstract wood elements. The work's monochromatic color gives a sense of unity to its disparate objects, the white finish suggestive of the untainted possibilities that dawn brings to each day. The tree-like standing columns, as tall as 25 feet, and vertical hanging pieces all underscore the forest-like atmosphere, allowing the viewer to walk under the "trees" as well as through them.

Nevelson worked on *Dawn's Forest* for more than a year, completing it in the spring of 1986. It is unusual among her environmental sculptures because of its size and its color; most of her other large works were

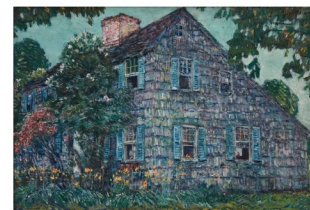
This exhibition is an acknowledgment of Olga Hirshhorn's legacy and a celebration of the collection she has left to Artis—Naples, The Baker Museum for this community to enjoy. Through a representative selection, the exhibition examines recurring themes in Hirshhorn's collection, including the friendships she and her husband, Joseph, maintained with prominent artists as well as her eclectic collecting practice.

Consisting of more than 400 works created by some of the foremost modern European and American artists such as Pablo Picasso, William de Kooning, Georgia O'Keeffe, Alexander Calder, Larry Rivers and Josef Albers, among others, *The Olga Hirshhorn Collection* reflects her diverse interests and tastes as a collector. Throughout the exhibition, pre-Columbian, African and Asian objects attest to Olga's passion for travel and non-Western arts and culture.

World-class Exhibition In a New Light

American Impressionism 1870-1940

In a New Light: American Impressionism 1870-1940 explores both the dissemination of Impressionism from its French roots to the American idiom and its reinterpretation of landscape painting. While the nation had large celebrated its centennial and reflected upon its past, American artists looked to Europe as a model for the future, reinterpreting and reevaluating the American tradition. Indeed, American artists of this period often sought training abroad, particularly in France, where they were exposed to *plein air* painting, or painting in the open air, and Impressionism. These artists would later translate the French genre into a uniquely American expression.

The more than 100 paintings and works on paper in this exhibition are drawn entirely from the Bank of America Collection. This selection gives distinct insight into the changing nature of American art during the period. It traces not only artistic advances toward *plein air* painting and Impressionism in the US but also the development of American
