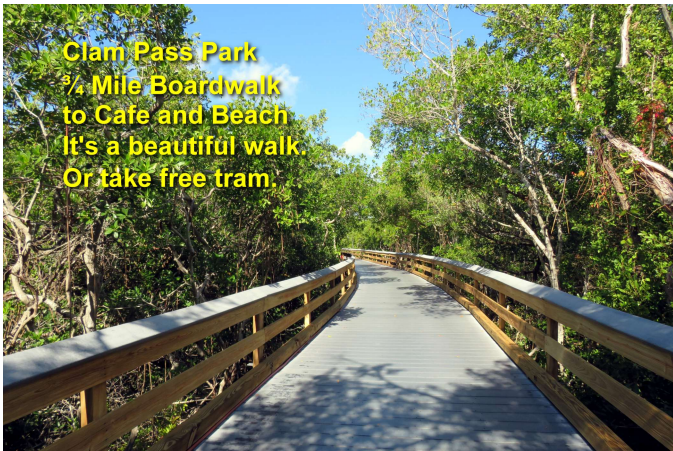
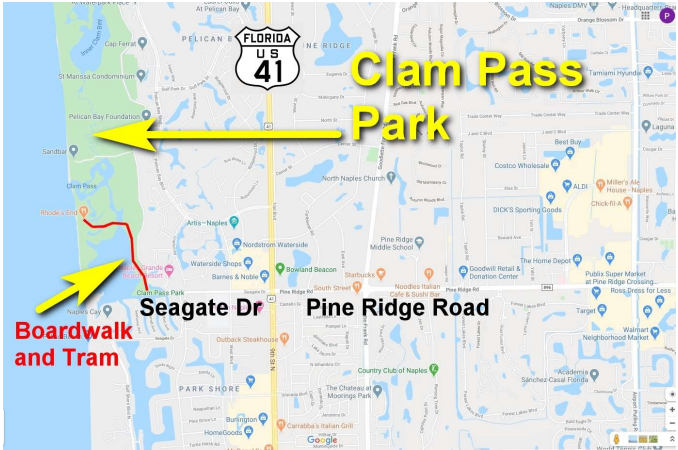


**Clam Pass Park (Collier County)**

COMMON SPIDERS OF CLAM PASS

- Spirited Observer** *Oreonema pacificum*
  - Very efficient hunter of other Florida spiders.
  - Female are 3.0 mm long and 2.0 mm wide. The dorsal shield is white with black spots, with 8 red dorsal spots. Males are 2.5 mm long and 1.5 mm wide. They have a grey streamer with white spots and no spots, but they are smaller.
  - Take of silk is 8-10 percent from flying into and descending the web.
- Small Spider** *Chilodactylus*
  - Female are 4.0 mm in length, males are 4.0 mm in length.

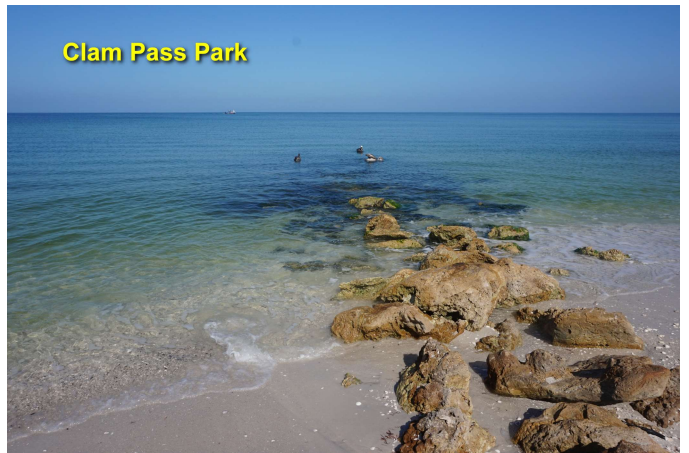
