

What: Waterfront park 1 mile E of I-75. Up-close views of non-captive manatees in season (mid-Dec-Mar). Manatees come in search of warm water in winter when temp in Gulf of Mexico is below 68° F (20° C). Warm water in Manatee Park comes from the Florida Power and Light power plant across the street.

Also: Public kayak launch and rental.



Range: Shallow, coastal areas and rivers. Caribbean, Gulf of Mexico, Amazon, W. Africa.



Main causes of death: Humanrelated issues – starvation due to habitat destruction and collision with human objects.
