Are you ready to Adopt?

Adopting a kitten is a wonderfully kind and heart-warming experience. However, before you succumb to falling in love with one, please ask yourself the following question: **“Do I really want all of the responsibilities that come with having a kitten?”** If you are not sure, then we encourage you to do some additional soul searching, reading, and research before making this decision. Adopting an animal requires a 10 to 20-year commitment on your part. It is best to know if you are truly ready.

We are here to help you select the best kitten for your lifestyle and needs based on our knowledge of the animal(s), and their needs, as well as our experiences and observations. It's not always as easy as saying, “I want THAT orange tabby.” Sometimes, we need to let the kitten choose us. We can also provide resources to help transition the kitten into your home smoothly and successfully.

Every kitten at Second Chance Kitten Rescue has already faced hardship.

Some were abandoned, others found alone and frightened on the streets. Many were picked up as strays and never claimed, or surrendered by people who could no longer care for them. Before their lives have truly begun, they've already endured more than most.

That's why we ask every potential adopter to be fully prepared—emotionally, physically, and financially. Welcoming a kitten means committing to their lifelong care: *annual* vet visits, *quality* food, litter, daily attention, boarding during vacations, and unexpected emergencies.

Did you know emergency vet bills can range from \$500 to \$5,000+? It's a wide and often unpredictable range. Are you financially ready to handle that if it happens?

These are important questions to reflect on. Because giving a kitten a second chance means being their forever safety net.

If you don't already have a cat at home, we strongly encourage you to consider adopting two kittens instead of one.

1. Why? Because kittens thrive with companionship. When you're busy, at work, or away on vacation, they'll keep each other company—playing, grooming, and curling up for naps together. They're especially active at night, and having a buddy helps them stay entertained while you sleep.
2. Just like humans need human connection, kittens need interaction with their own kind. It's not just about fun—it's about development. Through play and shared space, kittens learn how to communicate, set boundaries, and understand social cues. This helps prevent future behavioral issues like biting, hiding, or excessive shyness.
3. When kittens grow up with a feline friend, they're more confident, better adjusted, and often happier overall. And that makes them even more wonderful companions for you.
