Time for You (TFY)

Dementia respite care is an important resource for families caring for individuals with memory loss such as dementia. It allows caregivers to rest and recharge, which can improve their ability to care for their loved one while avoiding caregiver burnout and maintain a balance in their lives. Interfaith offers support! Time for You (TFY) is a Respite Day program for those with memory loss offered on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

TFY allows caregivers to step back and recover from the physical and emotional demands of caregiving. TFY offers caregivers time to focus on other areas of their lives, such as work, social relationships, and self-care. It allows caregivers to reconnect with family and friends, which can strengthen their support system and engagement in the community. This program can give caregivers the opportunity to tend to their own physical and emotional needs.

Respite care services such as TFY can give a person with dementia an opportunity to interact with others having similar experiences, spend time in a safe, supportive environment,

and participate in activities designed to match personal abilities and needs. The past couple of months at TFY, we have been very busy with the holiday season and look forward to making 2025 even more special for our respite group. We had many supporters from the community help us with craft projects, donate treats, and supply gifts to help our program be more successful. We try to do things that keep us all living in the moment, allowing the participants to be themselves and have fun. We have wonderful volunteers who give their time and talents to make every day at TFY exceptional.
