In the December, 2019 issue of Village Neighbors magazine, we featured a Village's lifestyle group called Acknowledging Acts of Kindness Club (AAOK). Their mission:

TO IDENTIFY AND ACKNOWLEDGE PEOPLE IN THE Community who have carried out acts of kindness.

The members of AAOK make it a point to recognize and reward those who have gone above and beyond in showing kindness to others. "People who help others are the best role models, and recognizing their acts of kindness helps to promote this behavior in our community and beyond and promotes a 'Culture of Kindness," explains president Lindsay Collier.

"This is the first club of its kind," said Joe Santoro, who spearheaded the formation of the group. All of the members carry cards they hand out as they observe acts of kindness. And you are encouraged to contact the club to nominate members of the community who deserve special recognition for their acts of kindness.



In March 2019, Anne Sheehan and her husband Terry rented a home in the Villages. Anne heard about the *AAOK Club* and was so impressed that she asked if she could start a club in her hometown of Dayton, Ohio. Anne has gone on to aggressively promote the club and their kindness cards in many schools and organizations in Dayton and the surrounding community. At this point she has circulated over 32,000 of these cards. The club awarded Anne with their first Kindness Certificate.

Collier and the members of the AAOK club want to share this message with their neighbors in the Villages: "Situations like this tend to bring out the kindness in people. So stay kind and look for opportunities to acknowledge others who display kindness," Collier.
