In December we had the pleasure of honoring Con Nguyen who was the last pilot to escape after the fall of Viet Nam. He was a South Vietnamese helicopter pilot who was a part of the **King Bees** that were responsible for saving many stranded and wounded soldiers during the war. In his last flight out, he carried out the heroic act of saving his family and 80 women and children from a remote island and landing them on the USS Okinawa under extremely difficult conditions.

The venue for this event was Seabreeze Recreation Center at the monthly meeting of the Aviators Club. Our thanks to Tweet Coleman for helping to orchestrate the event. It was an honor to acknowledge Con for his kind, brave act as well as his wife, Linda. They currently reside in the Village of Marsh Bend.










Wreaths Across America


