SERMON

SERMON

Today's bible readings invite us (you and me) to embrace God's future, whilst at the same time honouring the past. Through Isaiah, God speaks to a people whose experience and history is defined by God. But the words from God are startling. They are deeply challenging and shatter our sensibilities. God says this:

Do not remember the former things or consider the things of old I am about to do a new thing.

They are asked by God to set aside former things, to set aside tradition. They are presented with a new future beyond anything that they may have imagined. The One who delivered Israel from slavery will deliver them again. God is taking the initiative. God is presenting new possibilities to a people who saw no way forward.

Behold I do a new thing is an important message for churches to hear. God is saying through Isaiah; Do not remember the former things or consider the things of old. God is saying; Forget the old normal. I am about to do a new thing.

Throughout this pandemic we have had to change the way we do things. We have had to change just to stay alive. Who would ever have thought that little old St Chad's in Hopwas, would be on Facebook and would have its own website would have its services on line. Come on you're kidding me right, St Chad's Hopwas? It will never happen!

But Covid has changed everything, to the extent that when talking about getting through this Pandemic, people don't talk about getting back to normal. They talk about the "New Normal" and whatever that might be.

"I am about to do a new thing" says God through Isaiah I am about to do a new thing Even before this Pandemic broke out, many churches were struggling with money issues, with shrinking numbers, with aging congregations. It's very tempting to stop right where we are. To just continue as long as we can, with little hope for long term survival. But even if we wanted to, here at St Chad's, we will not be allowed to do so

Lichfield Diocese is launching what it calls its *Shaping for Mission* strategy. It involves all 28 deaneries in the Diocese and will be co-ordinated at Deanery level. And I suspect decided on by Bishops. Although ostensibly the focus is on Discipleship, Vocation and Evangelism, the cynic in me says this is all about money and will be based on the new Archbishop of York's idea (Stephen Cottrell - when he was Bishop of Chelmsford) that "*if you can't afford it, then you can't have it*"

With the likelihood that it will be at least another 18 months before a new Vicar of the Parish of Tamworth is appointed where does that leave us here at St Chad's?

What is abundantly clear though, is that if we do not know where we are going - we will end up in a place where we do not want to be, or no place at all. Even small struggling churches can be vital especially in engaging and encouraging others to be involved with the friendship of God. But it means that we too have to be open to *God's new thing*. But, new ways of doing church and faith need to be balanced by honouring tradition, and discovering the order that enlivens and inspires.

Our future will not depend on our own initiatives but our response to God's initiative. And by offering ourselves and opening ourselves in belief and humility to God's provocative possibilities for the future.
