The Divine Mercy Novena

The Divine Mercy novena is prayed between Good Friday and the Sunday of Divine Mercy, which is the Sunday following Easter. Those praying the novena are to pray for the special intentions of each day followed by the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.

St. Faustina wrote that Jesus told her, "On each day of the novena you will bring to My heart a different group of souls and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy ... On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My passion, for the graces for these souls. (Diary of Faustina, 1209)

Special intentions for souls during the Divine Mercy Novena:

Day 1 (Good Friday) – All mankind, especially sinners

Day 2 (Holy Saturday) – The souls of priests and religious

Day 3 (Easter Sunday) – All devout and faithful souls

Day 4 (Easter Monday) – Those who do not believe in Jesus and those who do not yet know Him

Day 5 (Easter Tuesday) – The souls of separated brethren

Day 6 (Easter Wednesday) – The meek and humble souls and the souls of children

Day 7 (Easter Thursday) – The souls who especially venerate and glorify Jesus' mercy

Day 8 (Easter Friday) – The souls who are detained in purgatory

Day 9 (Easter Saturday) – The souls who have become lukewarm.

Sr. Faustina and the Origin of Divine Mercy

In the 1930s, a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, began to receive private revelations from Jesus. She recorded them in her *Diary*.

In her *Diary*, one day she wrote that Jesus appeared to her in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays were pouring from his heart. These mysterious rays symbolized the blood and water that poured out from Jesus at his crucifixion for our salvation. Jesus asked that his image be painted and venerated throughout the world: “I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish” (*Diary*, no. 48) and “By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls” (*Diary*, no. 742). The Lord requested that the words “Jesus, I trust in You” be written under His image.

The Divine Mercy Chaplet

The Chaplet was also given to St. Faustina with this promise: “Encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given you” (*Diary*, no. 1541). “Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death. ... Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy. I desire that the whole world know My infinite mercy” (*Diary*, no. 687).

Sr. Faustina and The Hour of Mercy

In her *Diary*, Sr. Faustina recorded Jesus' words: “At three o'clock, implore My mercy, especially for sinners; and, if only for a brief moment, immerse yourself in My Passion, particularly in My abandonment at the moment of agony. This is the hour of great mercy for the whole world. I will allow you to enter into My mortal sorrow. In this hour, I will refuse nothing to the soul that makes a request of Me in virtue of My Passion...” (*Diary*, 1320).

Sr. Faustina and The Feast of Divine Mercy

St. Faustina wrote that Jesus requested that a feast of Mercy be observed. In fact, her *Diary* records His request 14 separate times.

For example:

"My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. ... Let no soul fear to draw near to Me. ... It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy. – St. Faustina, *Diary*, no. 699



St. Pope John Paul II and Divine Mercy Sunday

In his book, *Memory and Identity* (2005,)

St. John Paul II talks about Sr. Faustina's writings:

"This was precisely the time when those ideologies of evil, nazism and communism, were taking shape. Sister Faustina became the herald of the one message capable of off-setting the evil of those ideologies, that fact that God is mercy – the truth of the merciful Christ. "

On April 30, 2000, Sr. Faustina was canonized by Pope John Paul II. She is the patron saint of mercy.

On May 5, 2000, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

In Pope John Paul II's homily that day:

"As a gift to humanity, which sometimes seems bewildered and overwhelmed by the power of evil, selfishness, and fear, the Risen Lord offers His love that pardons, reconciles, and reopens hearts to love. It is a love that converts hearts and gives peace. How much the world needs to understand and accept Divine Mercy!

Lord, who reveals the Father's love by Your death and Resurrection, we believe in You and confidently repeat to You today: Jesus, I trust in You, have mercy upon us and upon the whole world."

St. Kateri Tekakwitha

1656-1680

Feast Day: April 17 or July 14



St. Kateri Tekakwitha - The Lily of the Mohawks

Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American saint of the United States and Canada. She was born in 1656 in upstate New York. Her family died of smallpox when she was 4, and the disease left her face badly scarred and her eyesight damaged. She was called "Tekakwitha," which means "she who bumps into things." Due to many wars in her area, she had to move frequently.

When she was 8 years old, Tekakwitha dedicated her life to God by remaining single and offering her life to Jesus. At age 18, she secretly began receiving Catholic instructions and was baptized on Easter Sunday. She was called Kateri after St. Catherine of Sienna. After joining the Church, Kateri was ridiculed, scorned and threatened. Eventually she escaped to the Mission of St. Francis Xavier, a settlement of Christians in Canada. On Christmas Day 1677, she made her First Holy Communion.

Kateri taught prayers to children and cared for the elderly and sick, often going to Mass both at dawn and sunset because of her great devotion to the Blessed Sacrament and to the Cross of Jesus. She was known for her gentleness, kindness, and love of nature. She was often seen going into the woods alone to seek God's voice in nature, leaving behind crosses formed with twigs as "stations" for those who followed her. She died on April 17, 1680, at the age of 24, and is buried in Kahnawake, Quebec, Canada. Witnesses reported that within a few minutes of her death, the pock marks from smallpox completely vanished and her face shone with radiant loveliness.

Before her death, Kateri promised her companions that she would continue to love and pray for them in Heaven. They immediately began praying for her heavenly intercession. Several people, including a priest who attended her during her last illness, reported that she had appeared to them and many healing miracles were attributed to her. She was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 21, 2012.

Her shrine is located in Fonda, New York, where she she was baptized and lived her teenage years. The shrine honors St. Kateri and all the Native peoples of the Americas. She is the patron saint of nature and ecology.

From the Easter Paschal Homily - St. John Chrysostom, Church Father, 5th century

Come you all: enter into the joy of your Lord. You the first and you the last, receive alike your reward. You rich and you poor, dance together. You sober and you weaklings, celebrate the day. You who have kept the fast and you who have not, rejoice today. The table is richly loaded: enjoy its royal banquet. The calf is a fatted one: let no one go away hungry. All of you enjoy the banquet of faith! All of you receive the riches of his goodness!

Let no one grieve over his poverty, for the universal kingdom has been revealed. Let no one weep over his sins, for pardon has shone from the grave. Let no one fear death, for the death of our Savior has set us free. He has destroyed it by enduring it. He has despoiled Hades by going down into its kingdom. He has angered it by allowing it to taste of his flesh. ...

It seized a body, and lo! it discovered God. It seized earth, and, behold! it encountered heaven. It seized the visible, and was overcome by the invisible.

O death, where is your sting? O Hades, where is your victory? Christ is risen and life is freed! Christ is risen and the tomb is emptied of the dead! For Christ, being risen from the dead, has become the Leader and Reviver of those who had fallen asleep.

To Him be glory and power for ever and ever. Amen.
