

Let us pray:



The Divine Mercy Chaplet

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen

OPENING PRAYER: (Optional)

You expired Jesus, but the source of Life gushed forth for Souls, and the Ocean of Mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelope the whole world and empty yourself out upon us.

O Blood and water which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fountain of Mercy for us, I trust in you! (Repeat 3 times)

All: OUR FATHER, HAIL MARY, THE APOSTLES CREED.

FOLLOW THE FIVE DECADES OF THE ROSARY.

ON EACH OF THE OUR FATHER BEADS PRAY:

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

ON EACH OF THE 10 HAIL MARY BEADS PRAY:

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have Mercy on us and on the whole world.

CONCLUDING PRAYER: (Repeat 3 times)

Holy God, Holy Mighty one, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

CLOSING PRAYER: (Optional)

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of Compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great Confidence submit ourselves to your Holy Will, which is love and mercy itself. Amen.



Feasts: the Assumption of Mary; the Transfiguration

The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary - August 15 Q: What evidence is there for Mary's assumption in Tradition and Scripture? A: As discussed by Pope John Paul II, during his General Audience, July 2, 1997:

The first trace of belief in the Virgin's Assumption can be found in the apocryphal accounts entitled Transitus Mariae, whose origin dates to the second and third centuries...

Later, there was a long period of growing reflection on Mary's destiny in the next world...

Belief in the glorious destiny of the body and soul of the Lord's Mother after her death spread very rapidly from East to West, and has been widespread since the 14th century...

Although the New Testament does not explictly affirm Mary's Assumption, it offers a basis for it because it strongly emphasized the Blessed Virgin's perfect union with Jesus' destiny. This union, which is manifested, from the time of the Saviour's miraculous conception, in the Mother's participation in her Son's mission and especially in her association with his redemptive sacrifice, cannot fail to require a continuation after death. Perfectly united with the life and saving work of Jesus, Mary shares his heavenly destiny in body and soul...

The Transfiguration of Jesus -from Homily of His Holiness, Pope Francis, Holy Mass for World Youth Day Lisbon, Portugal, on the Feast of the Transfiguration, August 6, 2023

After these exciting days, surely we feel like repeating the words of the Apostle Peter on the mount of the Transfiguration: "Lord, it is good for us to be here!" (Mt 17:4).

What will we take back with us? I would respond with these three words: to shine, to listen, and to be unafraid...

The first: to shine. Jesus is transfigured. The Gospel tells us: "his face shone like the sun" (Mt 17:2)... Jesus takes three of the disciples, Peter, James, and John, and leads them up the mountain, where he is transfigured. Through this brilliant burst of light, Jesus prepares the disciples for the dark night of the Passion.

Dear young friends, today we too need something of this burst of light, so that it can fill us with hope as we face the many failures of each day and the darkness that assails us in life...Yet, I would like to tell you that we do not radiate light by putting ourselves in the spotlight ... To love like Jesus: that is what makes us shine, makes us do works of love. Friends, I am telling you the truth: whenever you do works of love, you become light. But the moment you stop loving others and become self-centered, you extinguish your light.

Lectio Divina

Genesis 3: 1-7

Now the snake was the most cunning of all the wild animals that the LORD God had made. He asked the woman, "Did God really say, 'You shall not eat from any of the trees in the garden?"

The woman answered the snake: "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; it is only about the fruit of the tree in the middle of the garden that God said, 'You shall not eat it or even touch it, or else you will die." But the snake said to the woman: "You certainly will not die! God knows well that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods, who know good and evil."

The woman saw that the tree was good for food and pleasing to the eyes, and the tree was desirable for gaining wisdom. So she took some of its fruit and ate it; and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it. Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked; so they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves.

Revelation 12: 1-9

A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars. She was with child and wailed aloud in pain as she labored to give birth. Then another sign appeared in the sky; it was a huge red dragon, with seven heads and ten horns, and on its heads were seven diadems. Its tail swept away a third of the stars in the sky and hurled them down to the earth. Then the dragon stood before the woman about to give birth, to devour her child when she gave birth. She gave birth to a son, a male child, destined to rule all the nations with an iron rod.

Her child was caught up to God and his throne. The woman herself fled into the desert where she had a place prepared by God, that there she might be taken care of for twelve hundred and sixty days. Then war broke out in heaven; Michael and his angels battled against the dragon. The dragon and its angels fought back, but they did not prevail and there was no longer any place for them in heaven. The huge dragon, the ancient serpent who is called the Devil and Satan, who deceived the whole world, was thrown down to earth, and its angels were thrown down with it.

Luke 1: 39-45

During those days Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, "Most blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled."

Matthew 17: 1-9

After six days Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him.

Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and do not be afraid." And when the disciples raised their eyes, they saw no one else but Jesus alone.

St. Clare of Assisi - Feast Day August 11

Clare was eighteen years old when St. Francis, preaching the Lenten sermons at the church of St. George in Assisi, influenced her to change the whole course of her life. Talking with him strengthened her desire to leave all worldly things behind and live for Christ. She founded the Order of Poor Clares and was abbess for 40 years, living in poverty and service to the sick. She died in 1253.

St. Monica of Hippo

St. Monica was born North Africa in the 4th century. She was married to a pagan man and suffered greatly. Her son, later to become St. Augustine, was a talented young man but not a Christian. She fervently prayed that he might be converted from his dissolute life. Her prayers were answered when Augustine was 33 years old. He credited his conversion in part to her petitions to God on his behalf.

St. Augustine of Hippo

St. Augustine was a brilliant and learned man, leading a life of wealth and fame, rejecting Christianity. He began teaching rhetoric in Rome and Milan, a prominent occupation in the 4th century. His mother, St. Monica, prayed constantly for his conversion. After his baptism at age 33, he founded a monastery based in contemplation. He wrote hundreds of articles and books' the most famous was his "Confessions" where he writes "our hearts are restless until they rest in Thee."
