If you are not able to attend your church's scheduled hours of Eucharistic Adoration, but your church is open, you can still worship the Lord. Even though the tabernacle is locked, He is present always. Therefore, worshipping the Lord before the Tabernacle is acceptable.

Lenten Practices

Frequently Asked Questions

Why do we have a 40 day season of Lent?

The word “Lent” comes from the Middle English word “Lenten,” which meant “springtime.” Lent is the Church’s spring – a time for renewal and a reminder of the new life of baptism.

Why do we begin Lent by wearing ashes?

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 2, with the use of blessed ashes made from palms and branches used the previous Palm Sunday. These ashes serve as a visible reminder of the Lenten emphasis on prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

Why do we give things up during Lent?

During the 40 days of Lent, these three aspects of Lent - prayer, fasting, and almsgiving - are meant to prepare the Christian for the celebration of the Lord’s resurrection on Easter.

Week 1: PRAYER Ash Wednesday Mar 2 - Mar 5
Matthew 6:5-13;

When you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, who love to stand and pray in the synagogues and on street corners so that others may see them. Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you pray, go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you. In praying, do not babble like the pagans, who think that they will be heard because of their many words. Do not be like them. Your Father knows what you need before you ask him.

This is how you are to pray: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors; and do not subject us to the final test, but deliver us from the evil one.

And we have this confidence in him, that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us.

Week 2: FASTING March 6-12

Matthew 4: 1-3

Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil.

He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was hungry.

The tempter approached and said to him, “If you are the Son of God, command that these stones become loaves of bread” and said to him, “If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down. For it is written: ‘He will command his angels concerning you’ and ‘with their hands they will support you, lest you dash your foot against a stone.’

You expired Jesus, but the source of Life gushed forth for Souls, and the Ocean of Mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelope the whole world and empty yourself out upon us.

O Blood and water which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fountain of Mercy for us, I trust in you! (Repeat 3 times)

OUR FATHER, HAIL MARY, THE APOSTLES CREED.

FOLLOW THE FIVE DECADES OF THE ROSARY.

ON EACH OF THE 'OUR FATHER' BEADS PRAY:

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

ON EACH OF THE '10 HAIL MARY' BEADS PRAY:

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have Mercy on us and on the whole world.

CONCLUDING PRAYER:(Repeat 3 times)

Holy God, Holy Mighty one, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

CLOSING PRAYER: (Optional)

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of Compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great Confidence submit ourselves to your holy Will, which is love and mercy itself. Amen.
