Visit of the Apostolic Nuncio As you know His Excellency Archbishop Miguel Maury Buendía will be making a visit of our diocese between Monday 1st and Wednesday 3rd July. As the opening event of his time amongst Bishop Patrick would like to invite all clergy and faithful to a Mass of Thanksgiving on Monday 1st July, in our Cathedral, at 12.00 noon, and will have opportunity to greet the Nuncio immediately afterwards in the Cathedral garden.

A reflection from Pope Francis for the Year of Prayer, 12th Week of Ordinary Time: Three parables in Luke's Gospel emphasize how we need to be constant in our prayer. In the first a man asks for help from a friend in the middle of the night and does not give up until his friend responds; in the second a widow persists in asking the unrighteous judge for justice; in the third a publican and a Pharisee pray in the Temple. We see these three attitudes – insistence, patience and humility – reflected in the saints who persevered in prayer; may we persevere in prayer conscious that we never pray alone, but with Christ himself, in the power of the Holy Spirit. General Election 2024 : Consider how to vote at the General Election (4th July): some thoughts from the Bishops of England and Wales about Education. Catholic schools support parents as the primary educators of their children and welcome anyone who seeks a Catholic education for their child. The 2,100 Catholic schools make up 9% of the state-funded sector and are considerably more ethnically diverse than the national average, taking in more pupils from the poorest households, and outperforming state schools at GCSE. The Catholic community provides the government with rent-free land and buildings for schools, and by contributing to capital costs saves taxpayers hundreds of millions of pounds. This partnership with the State has resulted in protection of the core principles of Catholic education, such as the ability to give priority in admissions to Catholic children, and to teach a Catholic curriculum for Religious Education. Catholic education is popular with parents and successful in preparing pupils for life in modern Britain. However, there are campaigns to get rid of schools with a religious character, and to change the curriculum so that our schools would no longer be Catholic. Consider whether election candidates support the creation of new Catholic schools through the removal of the cap on faith-based admissions? Whether they recognise the importance of Catholic leaders, teachers and governors in maintaining the Catholic school ethos? How will they safeguard parents' rights as the primary educators including their right to withdraw their child from Relationships and Sex education and Religious Education?
