A Presentation on Apostolic Letter, Desiderio Desideravi: Pope Francis has issued a wonderful Apostolic Letter, Following Ann Finlay's (a Parishioner at OLSP) presentation on Desiderio Desideravi last week in both Churches, the Apostolic Letter is available on both Churches' websites. Monday June 5th is World Environment Day - in fact, the 50th of these. This year's theme is #BeatPlastic Pollution. This is an opportunity to reflect on how excessive use of plastics affects wild-life, particularly marine wildlife, and the communities which depend on them for their livelihoods. Perhaps we can engage with family, schools, employers, customers, to discuss reduction in plastic use, and pray for those affected by this pollution.
