Blessing of the Bambinelli On the Fourth Sunday of Advent, we are inviting you all to bring the baby Jesus (Bambinelli) from each of your Nativity sets to be blessed. This Advent tradition was first introduced by Saint John Paul II as a way for children to connect their Nativity scene at home to the celebration of Christmas at their church. The Bambinelli service will be held at Corpus Christi Church on Saturday 20th December at 6.00 pm Mass and Sunday 21st December at 10.30 am Mass and at Our Lady and St Patrick's Church on Sunday 21st December at 9.00 am Mass. Please remember to bring your baby Jesus for the blessing.

Wednesday 17th December Reconciliation Service at Corpus Christi at 7.00 pm
Our two priests will be joined by several other priests from neighbouring parishes to hear confessions on Wednesday 17th December at 7.00 pm. Getting your child baptised

If you have a child who is under 6 years of age and would like to have them baptised, please complete an application form at the back of church and give it to the Parish Priest. School admissions to Catholic Primary Academies (Reception Year) - Children born between 01/09/2021 and 31/08/2022. The deadline for submitting an application for school places is 15th January 2026. Application forms are available on the Local Authority (LA) where you live – Nottingham City or Nottinghamshire County Council website. For every Catholic school you apply for if you wish your child to be considered and ranked under a faith criterion you *should also complete a supplementary information form*, and return this form to the school by the deadline, (forms are available from the LA and the school). You must also include the supporting *evidence** ie a baptism certificate (photocopies are acceptable; contact the parish of baptism if you don't have a copy); failure to supply may affect your chance of a place.
