Continuing the Pope's September theme of caring for creation, here is further information which may help you make personal decisions on lifestyle which may help the planet. Experts from various countries agree that, after reducing waste, the next most important decision we can take to limit climate change is to reduce consumption of ruminant meat. Ruminant meat is mainly beef and lamb (and a few others) and the reason why these animals worsen climate change is because they produce methane as part of their digestion. Methane is as harmful a "greenhouse gas" as carbon dioxide, and it has been calculated that ruminant animals worldwide produce as much of a greenhouse effect as all the aeroplane travel in the world. The harm is even greater if the meat is imported, with the effects of transport pollution, or raised non- organically, with damage from other foodstuffs. No- one is suggesting that everyone should be vegetarian. Just remember. Live simply. Think about what you buy and eat."


