Dear Brothers and Sisters, We celebrate this weekend the Solemnity of Christ the King. The last Sunday of Ordinary Time, this solemnity was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 in the context of the growing secularization of the world. The Gospel



certainly gives us an opportunity to lay aside a lot of cultural baggage we may have about kings, leaders and kingdoms. The Jewish leaders want Jesus executed and so they bring him to Pilate who engages in a debate with Jesus on 'kingship'. Jesus is accused of claiming to be a 'king' and the gospel passage plays on both the political and religious meaning of that word. Through his ministry Jesus has shown them that His kingdom is unlike the one that Pilate, or many other earthly leaders know. It is a kingdom built on love, service, justice, reconciliation and peace. Pope Francis in his homily on the Feast of Christ the King in 2013 said, "Today we can think

about our own story, the path of our life. Each one of us has our history; we each have our mistakes, our sins, our happy moments and our sad ones. On a day such as this we do well to think about our own history, and to look at Jesus, and to say often, but from the heart, in silence, each one of us". Jesus is the centre of our history: which is built on love, service, justice, reconciliation and peace. We shall remember and reflect today that it is not only the history of humankind as a whole, but also of each individual person, you and me.
