'Oh let not the Lord be angry, and I will speak.'

In those days: The LORD said, 'Because the outery against Sodom and Gomorrah is great and their sin is very grave, I will go down to see whether they have done altogether according to the outcry that has come to me. And if not, I will know.' So the men turned from there and went towards Sodom, but Abraham still stood before the LORD. He answered, 'For the sake of ten I will not destroy it.'
