Mark will do a short (5-10 minutes) service of readings and reflections at the start of all Masses on the weekend of 6 & 7th September and Mass will then start a few minutes The bidding prayers and hymns during this Season of Creation will have more emphasis on environment and climate change.

It is open to anyone who is unbaptised, baptised in another denomination / faith or just interested in learning more about the Catholic faith. 


