
School admissions to Catholic Secondary Academies (Year 7) - Children born between 01/09/14 and 31/08/15. The deadline for submitting your application for a school place is 31 October 2025. Applications must be made on the website of the local authority (LA) in which you live-Nottingham City or Nottinghamshire County Council. For every Catholic school you apply for if you wish your child to be considered and ranked under a faith criterion you should also complete a supplementary information form, and return this form to the school by the deadline, (forms are available from the LA and the school). You must also include the supporting evidence* as required with this form, eg baptism certificate (photocopies acceptable). Failure to supply the required supporting evidence will mean your child is ranked in a lower criterion which may affect your chance of a place. *If you do not have the required evidence please contact the parish where your child was baptised for a copy certificate in good time.
