




Contactless Donations Machine
 The new contactless donation Machines enable parishioners to contribute to the collection, any second collection, mass intentions, candle donations or help to support special projects by debit or credit card. All you have to do is choose the amount you'd like to donate (anything from £1) and then either tap your card or swipe it. The machines can also record gift aid donations if you are a tax payer. Please ask for help to guide you, if you are not sure. You can also still donate online by using the QR code.

Pope Leo XIV's message for World Day of Peace—1st January 2026

"Peace be with you all: Towards an 'unarmed and disarming' peace" invites humanity to reject the logic of violence and war, and to embrace an authentic peace based on love and justice. This peace must be unarmed, that is, not based on fear, threats or weapons. And it must be disarming, capable of resolving conflicts, opening hearts and generating mutual trust, empathy and hope. The greeting of the Risen Christ, "Peace be with you" (John 20:19), is an invitation addressed to everyone — believers, non-believers, political leaders and citizens — to build the Kingdom of God and to work together to build a humane and peaceful future.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity: This annual Week of Prayer is celebrated from 18th January, ending on the feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul on 25th January. The theme in 2026 is 'One Body One Spirit' (Ephesians 4:4).

School admissions to Catholic Primary Academies (Reception Year) - Children born between 01/09/2021 and 31/08/2022. The deadline for submitting an application for school places is 15th January 2026. Application forms are available on the Local Authority (LA) where you live — Nottingham City or Nottinghamshire County Council website. For every Catholic school you apply for if you wish your child to be considered and ranked under a faith criterion you *should also complete a supplementary information form*, and return this form to the school by the deadline, (forms are available from the LA and the school). You must also include the supporting *evidence** ie a baptism certificate (photocopies are acceptable).

Membership of Catholic Associations

As part of an annual Return to the Diocese we need to record the number of parishioners who are members of any Catholic associations such as the Catenians, Knights of St Columba, Guild of St Elizabeth, Guild of St Stephen, any Catholic medical/nursing associations etc. If you have membership, please could you phone or email the parish secretary on the contact details at the top of page 3 of this newsletter.

Terminally Ill Adults (End of life) Bill: When the Bill was recently debated in the House of Lords 86 Peers delivered speeches, with 58 speaking in opposition to the provisions of the Bill and only 28 in favour. 

'The Word became flesh and dwelt among us.'
In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, *that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light. The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the Only Begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.* John bore witness about him, and cried out, 'This was he of whom I said, "He who comes after me ranks before me, because he was before me."

For from his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God; the only begotten God, who is at the Father's side, he has made him known.
