Secretary Report: Theresa Prebish - 1 minute

<u>President Report:</u> Jen Cramer

- The rug for the front entrance way will be ordered this month. The size that was measured was 18x14 which will cost \$4,000.
 - Not publicly released (security vestibule in design phase) increase security and take it into a modern situation. Library and main office space is same square footage so they will be swapping the two. There are 8 or 9 schools affected and contractor can only do 3 schools at once. Would start in March - 8 months to finish but could take longer. Tim recommends that we still purchase the rug.
- Officers for next year Need nominations for Secretary, Treasurer, Membership VP, Fundraising, Scholarship, MSAAC, SEAC
 - The PTSO will take the names of everyone and if there is more than one person for each position then PTSO will vote. There is room for everyone who wants to be involved.

<u>Administrators Round Table - Tim Flynn</u>

Mr. Flynn will address the following topics:

- Student changes what are the projected numbers of each class for 2019 2020? Student body will be larger at 1700 to 1756 students. There will be no destaffs for Stone Bridge. FTEs are up 1.8 to accommodate the increase in students. Class estimates: 408 freshman, 412 sophomores, 457 juniors, and 423 seniors.
- Building changes what changes are being made to our 20-year-old building beside changing the locations of the library and office?
 - CIP (Capital Improvement Project) over next 5 years (voted on and approved but can get switched around) - some bids are sealed bids
 - Gym roof blew off this year needs to be fixed
 - Minor water leaks
 - o fire alarm system Will be addressed when there are periods of no students
 - Auditorium lights replaced
 - Bell system (loses time) because clocks are not aligning
 - o 2 offices will be added to the main office
 - Entire school being re-keyed need to be able to open bathrooms or department doors with a single key and need keys for athletics - starting this project quickly (cost ~\$250,000)
 - Will install a few additional card readers
 - Promethean boards will be refreshed Will not know what they are replacing them with until the budget is approved. Tim guesses that they will be replaced with interactive projectors. In theory the boards/projectors should be able to communicate with the Chromebooks.
 - Repairs throughout the school with longer timeframes
 - Boiler (~\$500,000), water heater, track (~\$75,000), elevator (~\$95,000)
- Exterior changes beautification?
 - o drainage near the baseball fields? will be done but now being used
 - Traffic being reviewed to be more circular in nature
 - Hay Rd and Claiborne Pkwy are dangerous now. Traffic is a mess coming off Claiborne Pkwy.
- Graduation changes Any thoughts about doing the Class of 2020 graduation at SBHS instead of Eagle Bank arena?
 - Most likely graduation will be a weekday night for 2020 (needs to go through approval process before publicized)

- o Positive and negatives to both bugs, heat index, rain out
- Eagle Bank is easier. It would cost about \$8-10,000 to hold graduation at SBHS.
 It costs \$15,000 for Eagle Bank and SBHS will always have a slot at Eagle Bank.
 Tim has been told by other principals to not give up Eagle Bank.
- If there is a stadium that was closer and can hold everyone (3500 capacity min) then we could consider moving it closer to SBHS. SBHS stadium can hold 3500.

Status of Chromebooks -

- Are all teachers having students use this resource? Not always the best method for teaching
- Do you feel it is a successful initiative? For the 1st year they have done an
 excellent job. Two to three years of professional development is recommended
 before starting the use of Chromebooks.
- o Communication and Collaboration were the 2 main goals for the year.
- 2nd order change for some teachers where it was a 1st order change for other teachers.
- The biggest challenge is collecting them for the summer but the students do get same Chromebook back for next year.
- Personalized learning school and the use of digital tools go hand in hand.
- Goal is to have instruction at a level for all children at the school.
- Higher level kids needs voice and choice and options. They need to think critically and get to a creation level.
- Tim has put in an application this year to be accepted for training and is doing this in conjunction with Accreditation - 40 have agreed to be trailblazers for next year, show me group (40)- show me that the change is beneficial
- What is personalized learning? Lecturing to the students is not always the best technique. Lessons need to be crafted at an analysis and critical thinking level with station rotation. Children need a choice/options on how they demonstrate mastery.
- Tim has spent this year developing trust.
- SBHS has accountability with discipline. What happens with the children is confidential especially court cases involving students.
- Class offerings for 2019-20 what classes have been added, removed, updated?
 - Too early to say. Geospatial science is a new class (one full class Loudoun County High has 4 classes). There will be standard calculus, Latin 5 Honors and Latin 6 AP. Latin classes were taught in the same class and it is not right. German has the same situation and Tim will want to separate German as well, if possible. Latin is more crtical.
 - They will be hiring a testing coordinator and instructional facilitator.
 - A female PE position is being added to do a better job of monitoring females in the locker rooms.
 - Want to increase choice for students and offerings downside is a change in planning time
 - Want to offer world languages during all 8 blocks
 - Want to provide the option of math every day
 - Want to be able to have intervention and remediation during the day

- Want to offer Algebra in blocks 1 and 2 or 5 and 6
- PTSO goals and objectives what can the PTSO do to support SBHS? What do you think went well with PTSO this year and what needs to be improved?
 - o PTSO has been amazing and positive.
 - Instruction is key with 90 minute blocks for each class with the ability for the teacher to assess student knowledge 5 to 7 times during a teaching period.
- mental health training will SBHS be implementing this training next year for their students?
 - Yes, we will focus on sources of strength but we were not part of the Lady Gaga selection.
- Results from the accreditation committee are they in? What are areas for improvement? Where is the school excelling? Tim should have results in 45 days.
- Grading Any changes to the grading standards? Still appears to be an issue with some classes/teachers allowing retakes while others are not.
 - The county will be voting on grading and assessment for all schools.
