- Highlights included an MSAAC overview by MSAAC Chair Katrece Nolen and a summary review of the LCPS Equity Report issued earlier this year.
- MSAAC Is the Minority Student Achievement Advisory Committee
- Ways to promote equity in schools was discussed including Diversity & Inclusion
   Workshops and training for teachers and students and having Equity Teams at schools.
- Mr. Flynn later noted that An Equity Team being developed by Assistant Principal Kablan and that on March 3rd, the entire school staff will receive equity training.

#### Funds Request: Laurie Williams - Business/Marketing Teacher

• CyberPatriot Club fund request for membership fee - National Youth CyberPatriot program allows students to learn through a series of nationwide competitions - learn cyber security in a fun and team oriented way -not book work, let's students

experience what happens in the real world in CyberSecurity - teams will practice and compete in on-line competitions - some teams make it to the nationals competition Last year SBHS had 5 teams - this year, SBHS may have 10 teams. Total competition fee is \$2050. There are 120 students taking CyberSecurity this year. You don't have to be in a Cybersecurity class to be on the team.

- Ms. Cramer-Marden advised that PTSO gives funding to various school organizations based on a vote.
- After Ms. Williams left the rooms, The PTSO voted to fund \$250 to CyberPatriot (maximum amount per our budget per organization)

# <u>Administrators RoundTable - Tim Flynn - 20 minutes</u>

- Intro note Stone Bridge needs in-school parent volunteers during the day (every single day). Please consider volunteering!
- For the Stone Bridge School improvement plan (SIP) for 2019-2020, teachers, parents and students were involved in developing the goals for the year. The SIP is linked / aligned to the state and school division long-term goals based on data collected from surveys and the accreditation report. Academic stats have been solid, however math needs a bit of improvement. An opportunity gap is shown in performance data. Specific instructional strategies have been developed to address the students who need assistance in accordance with instructional best practice. Main point: make data driven decisions; collect data within the instructional block (during the 90 minutes) to see where the class is. Best practice research is used to develop strategies for improvement. Changing lessons as needed to allow higher level thinking to develop (instead of rote low level memorization) is part of the plan. SOL's is 80% of application not memorization.

Teams of teachers work together to improve instruction and lesson planning. Other data reviewed: disproportionality in discipline. Referral to the office data was analyzed. An Equity Team being developed by Sherry Kablan. March 3rd entire school will receive equity training. Other areas of data on referrals many were related to attendance. Stone Bridge is using the e-hall pass to reduce these referrals and help track location of kids. In under 25 minutes during a recent drill, every student was accounted for using the new system!

- School Threats Mr. Flynn wants to be very transparent and emails community as soon as possible to advise of the threat. He can't always advise of the details due to specific privacy policies that must be followed step by step. Refer to Policy 8290.
  - How are they handled? Specific policies and regulations by the school division are followed very carefully. We work with the sheriff's department very closely. Social media threats are taken very seriously and reviewed by the school and sheriff's department. If its a crime, it is processed as a crime. SBHS

handles these according to SB policy and Virginia regulations. School system resources has dramatically increased including hiring a director of Safety & Security who Mr. Flynn had to work with the day before school started. Mr. Flynn supports planned physical changes to the SBHS building to improve security such as changing the location of the office (office / library switch?). SB deals with security issues every day (even kids hiring DoorDash for food - not allowed!). These companies are NOT allowed because they are a security problem.

How are children with special needs planned for during evacuation? In the SB ERP (emergency response plan), there are special assignments for staff members to report and assist the special education classrooms. SB improved the bus locations and assigned specific spots for the buses so there is room in the front of the building for special education buses loading at the curb - to depart guickly.

Ms. Sajjan had a question regarding back to school night: Can we assign student volunteers to help parents with special health concerns use the elevator? Suggestions: perhaps parents with special health concerns can meet with parents ahead of time similar to the special education boot camp.
