<u>Guest Speaker</u>: Jordan Kanarek of College Wise -Top Secrets of College Admissions presentation! Preview: "Do I need the SAT or ACT? How many activities should I be doing? What do highly selective schools look for?"

Notes: Some schools are shutting down tours of colleges for parents of Sophomores and Juniors because of the coronavirus. Call the school in advance to make sure that the school is still open for you to visit.

5 Secrets of College Admissions:

- Test Scores Nowadays high test scores are not a guarantee of admission to an elite school. Having a 1590 doesn't get you in or out of an Ivy these days. Average SAT is 1090; ACT is 21. An important thing is to consider these days what the score can give you for the merit based aid (in-state tuition for out of state schools). Test scores are nowhere near as important as the other
- 2) Courses vs. Grades Schools are not just looking for higher GPA, they are looking for more honors and AP courses. Course rigor will stand out amongst the rest.
- 3) Activities There is a common misconception that a kid needs 30+ activities, etc. in order to get into a good school. Recommend 3--5 pointed activities that demonstrate the 3C's care/commitment/consistency (3Cs). Show deep care for the things that they do.
- 4) People knowing people: everyone has a friend who went to XXX school that could write a recommendation letter, but this doesn't always help. Similarly, being a legacy doesn't guarantee your child will get in (unless you go for early decision, maybe).
- 5) Be open to the balance of the list of schools to apply to, in-state / out-of-state options, safety schools, etc. It doesn't really matter as much where you go to school, it is what you study that will determine your earning potential upon graduation. Malcolm Gladwell Zeitgeist video about why going to the elite school may not as be as important as their rank within the school that they go to. 3-4 targets and 3-4 safety schools is the best plan.

What is Stone Bridge going to do if school is canceled?

Stone Bridge has made a very significant, detailed contingency plan for remote instruction if the school is closed for any long term amount of time. (Others in the district and our cluster may be modeling this plan). The plan requires delivering of instruction in a synchronous (live with teacher) and an asynchronous (independent) way.

SB will be using tools that teachers have access to to teach synchronously including

- LCPS Webex (allows instruction, modeling, scaffolding) to instruct synchronously
- Hyperdoc/Google classroom / Shared google docs to engage
- Office Lens, Flipgrid, Quizlet, Quizizz to elaborate
- Google form locked mode (primarily), Edpuzzle, Quizizz, Quizlet, Phoenix to evaluate
- Gaggle allows the school administration to monitor all words and phrases, text phrases, etc on student-issued chrome books. Gaggle alerts notifies admin of inappropriate communication. Gaggle also allows the administration to see if the student is working in certain programs.

SB will use tools that will allow teachers to deliver instruction asynchronously including

- Pre-recording of lectures
- Google classroom
- More writing may be required (and some students may struggle will this) but it will be required to maintain rigor & communication

Teachers will receive training to help them gain new skills in the remote instruction arena.

LCPS Facilities Plan for the building for COVID-19

- Cleaning products used in schools are OSHA regulated and are commercial strength and school only uses cleaners that LCPS supplies. Each of these products are OSHA marked with symbols related to the hazard. Color indicates the use. Training is required to work with these cleaning products. Training for the administration is complete; training is available to teachers. NO household cleaning products are allowed to be used at the school (due to the lack of OSHA hazard symbols). 10 teachers have already completed this course so that they can use the lcps supplied sanitizer. Some formal guidance about this will be communicated to parents shortly on this issue.
- Every head custodian in the district was at SBHS on 3/10 to refresh their training on the cleaning procedures for each school regarding the chemicals and procedures.
- These cleaning products and procedures aren't new they happen every day here at SB. Two areas have special cleaning protocols: the weight room, the wrestling room (staph infection, MRSA, and ringworm risks).
- Effective tomorrow, there will be separate entrances into the nurses office for sick and not-sick students.
- Question to Kevin Lewis (head of LCPS custodial services who also was in attendance) there is a contingency plan for deep cleaning COVID virus is one of the easiest to kill;

If 30% of the school were to become ill, the biohazard risk certified cleaning technician would lead the team to deep clean - all done in house, Loudoun has a plan and they have the equipment.
