1. VCU Dr. Barksdale

Racism - is often shaped by overt extreme expressions of bigotry, oppression that perpetuates inequalities (individual, system, subculture, institutional)

By doing Nothing, you uphold a system of oppression. Dr Barksdale went into further detail about types - Racist - non racist etc.

Keep in mind: Hybrid will only take place if it is safe to do so.

Questions after the presentation:

Q: Do you know what % of people have chosen hybrid (H) vs on-line (DL) of the 40% completed so far?

A: 1st semester 60% of families selected H, 40% DL. Early data now for the 2nd semester, of the 40% of the 1800 students that have responded as of 5 pm today 11/17 at 5p, 42-45% have selected H - BUT this is only 40% of the student population.

Q: For students taking arts/tech ed...will they do hands on learning? I heard no so that it's equitable for kids who are doing DL.

A: They will do hands on learning when it can be safely incorporated following the Covid protocols.

Q: Will teachers be given an additional device to be able to teach AND interact with kids at home? Pilot feedback I saw online said that the teachers need another screen to manage it.

A: Some teachers at home are already using multiple screens. Primary additional equipment coming is a microphone into the center of the classroom. There is a high quality large screen already in all the classrooms and that will be able to plug into the laptop. There is concern with additional equipment beyond that because the laptop performance slows. When we bring the teachers back in, we will practice, and do simulations and pilots in the building WHEN all the filtration etc is set up, and then we will pull in all the teachers and stream everything at the same time and then we will know that this is working adequately. This is Mr Flynn's goal, to see it IN THE BUILDING.

Q: What's with the teepee behind you Mr. Flynn?

A: That is the reading teepee where he reads to his young daughters. That is where all the reading takes place. And he fits in that teepee!

Thank you all for all your support. Mr. Flynn is happy to see the seniors have painted the rock. Also, the tiles for the class of 2020 look great; they are mounted in the cafeteria. If you are in the building, check them out!
