Mr. Flynn: Overview of Stone Bridge:

Course selection with guidance counselors is happening now; interesting new offerings are available; a couple of programs and classes that instead of "cutting" them due to low enrollment, we are able to offer via virtual learning and will include other high schools (e.g. Mandarin); staff/teacher vacancies have been filled and are part of a new academic excellence/high quality teaching of SB. ASL continues to be a challenge due to lack of a teacher, trying to avoid that but as of today, it is not looking positive for the school division (interpreters make more than teachers). District level solution is being investigated (teacher may be at another school).

Today (4/20) began the 4-day return of students who selected in-person learning; went well with the current modified covid protocol; students in the building were brilliant. Cafeteria seating is not assigned here at SB (other HS do have assigned). Codes scanned to identify where they are at lunch (kids did great at this).

Graduation Update: Changes!

4 main activities:

Senior Awards - week of graduation

Senior Pick-up & Breakfast - 9am to 1pm - Seniors will pick up senior cords & caps & gowns in a drive through format and they will receive physical tickets to allow people into the gate (electronic method could be problematic); teachers will also turn in their textbooks & laptops

Project Graduation team will host a breakfast that day

6/10 from 9 am to 3 pm there will be a graduation practice and picnic. Graduating from the stadium will be all new. Following is the picnic hosted by Project Graduation.

Graduation ceremony will be Friday 6/11 at 7pm at SB Football stadium (rain or shine!) committed for a lot of reasons for that specific day due to travel the next day, etc. In case of severe weather, it would be earlier in the day for example before storms might hit. Each graduate will receive 5 tickets and live viewing remotely; families will be 10 feet apart per "family circle". 3000 chairs will be available! Chairs will be set up on the turf - chairs that are being rented will be OK for turf and on track for both sides in groups of 5, 10 feet apart; and in bleachers it will be groups of 5, 10 feet apart as well (that holds 800 people) So the entire bleachers/turf/track will be needed for all.

Photos will be able to be taken around the campus (outside; Other days will be scheduled for photo opportunities / scheduling a time differently when there will be less people around if needed. (6/7-6/8)

Parking could be tight for graduation - Trailside has been reserved for parking plus a shuttle bus will assist (cleaned between each run); walkers encouraged also.

Key thing for SB graduation that night: we will be very flexible to make it successful. If there is a situation that we can adapt or overcome, gator's available to get grandparents for example to their seat; there will be a medical tent with water; Beautiful night under the stars planned!! Graduation ceremony will be about 80 minutes.

It was exciting today to see the school LOUD! Very positive things have happened academically; National Merit Scholars. Many students have won scholarships. Athletic teams have done great! Very excited to talk about this year's class at the graduation. Questions:

Will the graduation event be live-streamed? Yes, professionally live-streamed and there will be a professional sound system and links will be provided. 2 cameras will be used (1 on stage and 1 behind the stage to capture whole stage)

Will seniors vote on a graduation speaker? Yes, and typically it is a member of the faculty; Mrs. Williams: Senior schoology page has the vote information

Will seniors walk across the stage? Yes. Only one ramp so it will be a little different (right to left/one way).

Can people stand outside the fence? Yes, he has no problem with that.

Can families turn in tickets to the office if they don't need all 5 and the office can give out tickets to families who need more? Yes.

Are the seating pods on a first come first served basis? Yes, there will a time when folks can enter the stadium and chairs will be set up in groups of 5; it will be a giant horse shoe around the stage - groups of 5 chairs 10 feet apart on 10 meters on each side and then the bleachers It is a stadium and will be able to see as best they can. Ticket process will be very easy - show ticket and walk in; graduates will come in the gate by snack bar to proceed to seats in front and family will be in the main gate.

Does a graduate need a ticket? No...the ticket is for the family. If there is a family member in the band or choir, they don't need one of the tickets because they are part of the event. Band or choir - doesn't count as a spectator.

Do advanced diplomas get a different color cap & gown? No.

Are they allowed to decorate their caps? Yes! Height limited though...because the person sitting behind them has to see;

Mrs. Williams - flat decoration is required on the cap...and has to be "appropriate". Will special needs graduate students have support during the ceremony? Yes, always.
