About the Workshop

The Model

Child-Centered Play Therapy (CCPT) was developed by Virginia Axline and draws its foundation from the principles of Client-Centered Therapy by Carl Rogers.

CCPT rests on the belief that, if given the right environment, human beings will always innately move towards wellness. As such, the premise of CCPT is that, if a clinician can create a safe and therapeutic environment within the playroom, children will initiate the work they need to do to resolve the presenting problem.

Play is a child's primary language and mode of communication. Play serves important child developmental purposes, including motor, social, emotional, intellectual, and mastery skills. Through play, children attempt to organize and integrate their experiences and their internal world. It is by expressing, through play – the process of externalizing the images and symbols from the inner world, through a creative medium that is witnessed in sensory form and honoured by a skilled and trained therapist who is fully present – that a deeper level of growth and healing occur.

CCPT is an empirically supported approach for children 3-12 years and older that helps children express feelings, heal trauma, develop emotional regulation and problem-solving skills, as well as enhance self-esteem.

Didactic Information

Instructors teach participants relevant information, including:

- History
- Theoretical Foundation
- Rationale and implementation of skills
- Recognize and understanding themes
- etc.

Case Presentations and Videos

Instructors share case stories and videos to help students integrate their theoretical learning into practice.

3
Live Demonstrations

Instructors engage in role play demonstrations in front of the group to provide students with an in-the-moment example of learned skills 4

Role-Play Skills Practice

Participants engage in a number of significant role-play skills practice sessions that are fully observed by an instructor. Participants receive direct verbal and written feedback from an instructor.


