## 10 OSHA ANSWERS

1. A COMPETENT PERSON IS SOMEONE WHO KNOWS THE SCOPE OF WORK AND WHO IS CAPABLE OF IDENTIFYING EXISTING OR PREDICTABLE HAZARDS IN THE SURROUNDINGS OR WORKING CONDITIONS WHICH ARE HAZARDOUS AND HAS THE AUTHORITY TO SHUT DOWN OPERATIONS.

10. SAFETY DATA SHEETS- A FORM WITH DATA REGARDING THE PROPERTIES OF A PARTICULAR SUBSTANCE. IT IS INTENDED TO PROVIDE WORKERS AND EMERGENCY PERSONNEL WITH PROCEDURES FOR HANDLING OR WORKING WITH THAT SUBSTANCE IN A SAFE MANNER AND INCLUDES INFORMATION SUCH AS PHYSICAL DATA, MELTING POINT, BOILING POINT, FLASH POINT, TOXICITY, HEALTH EFFECTS, FIRST AID, REACTIVITY, STORAGE, DISPOSAL, PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT AND SPILL HANDLING PROCEDURES.
