


# **Political Update for NBA**

## Outlook for the 2022 Election

One U.S. Senate seat and all Representatives, all constitutional officers, including the Governor, will be on the ballot in 2022, in addition to all 42 State Assembly seats and 11 of the 21 State Senate seats.




Early voting runs from October 22 through November 4, and election day is November 8. However, mail-in ballots have started to be distributed to registered voters since September 25. Each county had a different date of mailing ballots.



#### **Constitutional Office Races**


All Constitutional offices in Nevada are up for re-election – Governor, Lt Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, Treasurer and Controller.






#### Governor's Race

Incumbent Governor Steve Sisolak is the Democratic nominee. On the GOP side, Clark County Sheriff Joe Lombardo came through in the Primary. There is an Independent American Party and one Libertarian in the race as well.




Latest polling numbers show this race in a dead heat, with Lombardo having a slight edge in some, but still within the margin of error.

#### Legislative Leadership

Between legislators being termed out and others running for other offices, we will see significant changes in the leadership of both houses.

In the Senate, Majority Leader Nicole Cannizzaro will remain the Leader barring some unforeseen upset. Chief Majority Whip Pat Spearman, who is midterm, is running for North Las Vegas Mayor. Minority Leader James Settelmeyer and Assistant Minority Leader Joe Hardy are both termed out.

In the Assembly, Speaker Jason Frierson is not running for re-election and Majority Leader Teresa Benitez-Thompson is termed out. Speaker Pro Tempore Steve Yeager is running for re-election. Majority Whip Edgar Flores is running for a Senate seat. Minority Leader Robin Titus is running for a Senate seat and Minority Whip Glen Leavitt is not running for re-election.


#### **Ballot Questions**


While Nevada always has ballot questions each election cycle, three made the ballot:

- Question 1: Proposes to guarantee equal rights (if passed, becomes law)
- Question 2: Proposes to prospectively increase the required minimum wage paid to employees (if passed, becomes law)
- Question 3: Proposes to amend the Nevada Constitution to allow for open primaries and ranked-choice voting (if passed, returns to the ballot in 2024)
