

# GUIDE TO COMMUNITY CLEAN-UPS

While locations are selected to reduce risk, the desert landscapes can have potentially dangerous surroundings and discarded materials. <u>Your safety</u> <u>comes first</u>. CoCoAV asks that you protect yourself and others by following this guide



The following items should be placed alongside your stacked bags:

- Items with dull, pointed edges that <u>might tear a bag</u>
- Large items that would prevent a bag from being tied/closed
- <u>Heavy items</u> that could tear a bag, provided that the item can be moved without causing harm
- **Filled containers** if the contents won't spill when

### WHAT TO BAG

Any small items or containers made of <u>paper, cardboard, plastic, styrofoam</u>, <u>wood, rubber, glass, or metal</u> may be picked up and placed in your bag

#### Note: Avoid anything with sharp edges



moved and you can identify the product is NOT hazardous

Note: If you suspect that an item contains urine, do not move it!



#### **UNSURE?**

Just leave the item! Better to err on the side of caution

#### WHAT TO LEAVE

The following items should be left without taking further action:

- <u>Sharp, large, or heavy items</u> that could cause physical injury if moved
- <u>Items in an unsafe location</u> (within six feet of a traffic lane, on unstable ground, etc.)
- Securely closed items containing hazardous substances
- <u>Items you can't identify</u> and suspect may be hazardous
- <u>Unclosed or leaking items</u>
- Items with <u>hazardous material</u> <u>labels</u>
- Items that could be <u>crime-scene</u>
  <u>evidence</u>

## Note: Keep a safe distance away from these items!
