## Obituary.

August Bergman, Sr. was I born near Breslau, Silesia, Ger. 6 many, Jan. 21, 1828. He was consecrated to God in baptism e by his parents in his infancy, and at the age of about fourteen n become a communicant member n of the Lutheran church by the rite of Confirmation. Jan. 8, 1851 he united in marriage with Miss Caroline Gettler. After a few years of married life in their native land they came to America in 1859, locating in Schuyler county Mo., where they have lived ever since, excepting four years during the rebellion while father Bergman served in the army, Mrs Berman and her young family lived in Canton, Mo. There were born to father and mother Bergman eight t children, two of whom have preceeded them into eternity.

In the spring of 1862 father
Bergman enlisted in Company A
218t Missouri volunteer Infantry
and continued three years and
three months. Soon after his
discharge from the army they
returned to their home in this
county where they have resided
since.

At the organization of the St John's Evangelical Lutheran church, August 24, 1866, both father and mother Bergman entered as charter members and continued exemplary and worthy members till God said, "it is enough, come up higher." After the death of Mrs Bergman Nov. 5, 1905, father Bergman made his home with his son Robert and family. Though failing raqidly in health and streng th for the past year no one, even of his most intimate friends, anticipated his sudden departure. He died suddenly at an early hour Wednesday morning Aug. 26, 1908, in the triumphs of a living faith at the ripe old age of Eighty years, seven months and five days.

Of father Bergman we may truly say, "a good man has gone." The interment was made in the Lutheran cemetery on Thursday evening and the funeral service conducted by Rev Dr. Jacoby, his pastor, in the St. John's Lutheran church on Friday Aug. 28, 1908 at 11 a. m.
