

WILLIS PERRY OF QUEEN CITY VICINITY DIES

George Willis ("Doc") Perry, 68, lifelong Schuyler county resident, passed away at the home of his daughter, Mrs. James Harker, five miles northwest of Queen City, about four o'clock Wednesday afternoon. Mr. Perry had been ill for the past three months.

The son of George and Elizabeth (Cooper) Perry, he was born on March 12, 1891 on a farm east of Queen City. On May 8, 1917, he was married to Bessie Aldridge and to this marriage one daughter was born. Mr. Perry had served as a veterinarian around Queen City where he also was engaged in farming during his entire lifetime.

Surviving are the daughter, Mrs. James (Bonnie) Harker, of Queen City rural route; three grandchildren, Mrs. Billy, (Janet) Bunch of Kirksville, and William and Carol Harker of the home; one great-granddaughter, Debra Jan Bunch; two sisters, Mrs. George (Lydia) Johnson, Queen City and Mrs. Clara Moll, Hillsboro, Ore.; two brothers, Edgar Perry, of Kirksville and Wilbert Perry, of California. He was preceded in death by his parents and seven brothers.
