

## Clara Schubert

Clara E. Schubert, 79, of Greentop died late Sunday morning, October 5, 1975 in the Kirksville Manor Care Center, Kirksville, where she had been a patient 22 months.

The daughter of Samuel H. and Martha Neeley Snowbarger, she was born southeast of Lancaster on October 20, 1895. On April 20, 1924 in rural Queen City, she was married to Louis Franklin Schubert who preceded her in death on July 30, 1964. Also preceding her in death were two sisters, one brother and one half-sister.

Surviving are one son, Donald Schubert of Queen City; one daughter, Mrs. Russell (Rosabel) Bushnell of Queen City; one daughter-in-law, Mary Maude Schubert and one son-in-law, Russell Bushnell, both of Queen City; three grandsons, Henry and Edwin Schubert and Mark Bushnell; one sister, Ruth Snowbarger of Aurora, Illinois and one half-sister, Bertha Schmitter of Kahoka.

Mr. and Mrs. Schubert spent their entire married life in the Germania community northeast of Queen City where they were engaged in farming. Following their retirement in 1954 they moved to Greentop.

She was a member of the St. John's Lutheran Church and

had been active in the Ladies Aid Society of that church. After moving to Greentop she attended the Greentop United Methodist Church and was a member of the United Methodist Women's Society.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock in the St. John's Lutheran Church northeast of Queen City. The Rev. Harold E. Spradling, pastor of the Faith Church United Methodist of Kirksville conducted the services. Burial was in the Germania Cemetery.

The body was at the Dooley Funeral Home in Queen City, where it remained until noon Tuesday, when it was taken to the church.
