## Fallen Asleep.

Feb. 8, 1862 he united in marriage with Miss Mary Mullet to whom ten children were born, six sons and four daughters. Five sons, four daughters, twenty grand children, an orphan girl whom he raised from infancy, two half c brothers with many relatives a and other friends remain to mourn his departure. His beloved companion preceeded him to their home yonder March 29, 1894. One Son died in infancy. He was converted in his youth and in 1847 united with the Reformed Protestant church of Switzerland. After coming to Schuyler Co. he united with the St. John's Evangelical Lutheran church of Germania of which he continued a steadfast and faithful member until his death.

After several years of failing health from a complication of deseases a recent attack of the Grippe quickly broke his strength, at about midnight Feb 25, 1907 God said to him, "it is enough, come up higher," at the ripe age of seventy-four years, four months and three days. Thus one by one God takes His own unto himself

The funeral services were conducted in the Germania M. E. Church on Wednesday, Feb. 27, 1907, by Rev. Dr. Jacoby, pastor of the Evangelical Lutheran pastorate of Queen. City, and the interment in the Germania Lutheran cemetery.
