Final Rites For Junior Snowbarger

Junior Edwin Snowbarger, 77, of Queen City died Wednesday night in the Veterans Hospital in Columbia, where he had been a patient three and one-half months. Born in Schuyler county on November 18, 1895, he was the son of John B. and Louise Figge Snow-barger. On December 28, 1924 at Kirksville, he married Ruth Bergman who survives. Also surviving are two sons, Warren Snowbarger of Greentop and Max Snowbarger of Lancaster; one daughter, Mrs. Donald (Anna Lou) Wheeler of Queen City; two brothers, Wilbert Snowbarger of Queen City and Herman Snowbarger of Greentop and seven grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by one son, Kenneth Edwin Snowbarger in infancy; one granddaughter, Patricia Lynn Snowbarger; one sister and two brothers.

Mr. Snowbarger was a life-long resident of Schuyler county, where he was engaged in farming. For one term he served as Schuyler County Treasurer.

He was a veteran of World War I serving with the United States Army from Sept. 18, 1918 during a battle engagement in France he was wounded and received the Purple Heart.

Mr. Snowbarger was a member of the St. Johns Lutheran Church east of Queen City and VFW Adair Post 2508.

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon at two o'clock in the Dooley Funeral Chapel in Queen City.
